PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The Leadership Project helps youth identify and understand roles, attitudes, tasks and functions of effective leadership. Youth learn to plan, organize, and implement a program or activity and can serve in leadership roles.

- Research and understand leadership and motivational theories
- Serve as a committee chair, officer or leader for a 4-H club

- Give a presentation about leadership opportunities for 4-H members and civic groups
- Develop leadership and team building activities and ice breakers for club meetings

- Strengthen interaction with meaningful committee work
- Reflect on completed programs and activities and how to improve them
- Identify characteristics of good leaders
- Prepare, practice and deliver a presentation

ADVANCED

- Serve in leadership roles in your 4-H program
- Demonstrate characteristics and skills of a successful leader
- Effectively organize thought and communicate ideas
- Understand parliamentary procedure and how roles are essential to organizations
- Research different leadership styles

- Attend a 4-H leadership conference
- Interview community leaders
- Conduct an event that promotes your 4-H club or county program
- Run for a local/county 4-H office position
