FROM SEAMLESS ADMISSIONS TO SEAMLESS TRANSFER: WHAT'S GOING ON IN LOUISIANA

Dr. Tristan Denley, Deputy Commissioner for Academic Affairs and Innovation at the Louisiana Board of Regents, is known as a national leader in transformational work using data-driven education redesign. Louisiana's attainment goal mirrors that of Kentucky - 60% of all working-age adults (ages 25-64) in Louisiana to hold a degree or high-value credential by 2030 - and their work is proving successful. In this session, Dr. Denley will focus on the state's initiatives to create seamless transitions for students from admissions to transfer as well as policy changes and innovative practices that aim to improve accessibility, reduce barriers, and streamline the path for students moving between two-year and four-year institutions.

1 Connect the Path: Dual Enrollment and Equity Pathways

Aurely Garcia Tulloch is a senior research assistant at the Community College Research Center (CCRC), where she investigates effective strategies for supporting historically underserved students in dual enrollment and transfer. At CCRC, she co-authored the DEEP (Dual Enrollment Equity Pathways) Insights report and in this session, she'll elaborate on the findings using her personal experience as a former dual enrollment and transfer student to bring the message home.

2 Chart the Path: Faculty Mindset Impact on Student Academic Success

Dr. Chris Hulleman is a professor of education and public policy at the University of Virginia as well as the founder and director of the Motivate Lab, which collaborates with educational practitioners to help ameliorate systemic racism and inequality. In this session, he will explore the power of the Faculty Mindset and how faculty and instructors across disciplines can apply principles to enhance student Growth Mindset, Purpose, and Belonging in their courses which then lead to improved academic success and decreased equity success gaps.



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- 3 **Continue the Path: Impact of Belonging & Basic Needs on Mental Health**
Dr. Erica Riba is the Director of Strategic Higher Education Initiatives at The JED Foundation where she oversees special projects and initiatives focused on Higher Education building communities of practice focused on mental health and suicide prevention. In this session, Dr. Riba will explore the impact of belonging and basic needs on student mental health and wellness and how we can proactively support students to reduce and address mental health concerns.
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- 4 **Complete the Path: What about Quality?**
Dr. Carol G. Schneider is the president emerita of the American Association of Colleges and Universities (AACU) and is widely recognized as both a voice and force for strengthening the quality of student learning in college for all students and especially those historically underserved in U.S. higher education. Her session will focus on recent work on initiatives related to equitable access that addresses both students' career aspirations in an innovation-fueled economy and graduates' development as capable and engaged citizens.
