

Do you need an interpreter or other reasonable accommodations?

Tell the person at the front desk or ask your caseworker. SCDSS will not charge you for:

- Interpreters in your language, including sign language
- Forms and letters in your language
- Forms and letters in large print or Braille
- Interviews by phone or at another accessible place

POLICY: SCDSS is an equal opportunity employer and provider. SCDSS will provide services and benefits to all eligible participants regardless of race, color, sex, age, national origin, religion, political beliefs, or disability. This policy applies to DSS employees, volunteers and providers.
