\*\* Effective June 4, 2015, Governor Haley signed into law the Domestic Violence Reform Act. With this legislation came changes to the approval authority of batterer intervention programs from the Department of Social Services to the Circuit Solicitor: "To amend section 17-22-90, relating to pretrial intervention programs and agreements required by offenders in a program, so as to require the Circuit Solicitor, or Attorney General if appropriate, to select and approve a batterer's treatment program for use as part of pretrial intervention for certain domestic violence offenses."

\*\*\* Reflects the number of unduplicated clients served by providers. (Unduplicated=unique individuals)

\*\*\*\* Residential and Non-Residential Counseling services, including individual and group counseling sessions. The number was calculated from data submitted by providers per Federal Grant requirements. This data reflects the number of service contacts; not individuals. Each time a person is seen for services it is counted as a service contact. Therefore, one individual could be counted several times in this data.

\*\*\*\*\* This number is from July 1, 2014 through May 31, 2015. June was not included as the Domestic Violence Reform Act went into effect immediately upon Governor Haley's signature on June 4, 2015
