SP Codes: The Mass Withdrawal Report is due by June 15, 2024 or your last day of school, *whichever comes first*. To claim services provided by the Literacy Grant for eligible migratory children on your Mass Withdrawal Report you will need to follow the guidelines listed below:

- SP Code "A": Eligible migratory children who received a book provided through the Literacy Grant
- SP Code "L1": Eligible migratory children who received a book and participated in a related literacy instruction/activity led by a **migrant funded certified teacher**
- SP Code "L2": Eligible migratory children who received a book and participated in a related literacy instruction/activity led by a **migrant funded non-certificated individual**

Note: You do not need to report SP Code "A" separately for an individual child if the service was provided together with SP Code "L1" or "L2". For example, if a child received a book and participated in a literacy instruction/activity led by a migrant funded certified teacher, you would only claim SP Code "L1".
