BOXING

1932-1960

HISTORY

The National Collegiate Boxing Championships were discontinued in 1961. The National Collegiate Boxing Championships were first conducted on an annual basis in 1937 although two earlier tournaments were held in 1932 and 1936 to qualify collegiate boxers for the final Olympic tryouts.

After the 1932 Olympic tryouts at Penn State and the 1936 tryouts at the University of Virginia, the NCAA Boxing Rules Committee decided to conduct a tournament each year, placing the sport on the same basis as other National Collegiate Championship events sponsored by the NCAA.

The University of Wisconsin tops the all-time tourney field in the number of team championships (eight) and number of individual titles (38). In the 24-year history of the event, 34 institutions have been represented by a National Collegiate individual champion.

The attendance record and the record for the largest individual field entered in the event were established at Wisconsin. A total of 49,800 fans attended the three-day, 1948 Championships held at Wisconsin, and 15,000 crowded into the final sessions of the 1947 and 1948 meets, also held in the Badger fieldhouse.

The 70 entries for the 1952 Championships at Madison mark the top field. A high of 31 institutions were represented at Penn State in 1951.

AWARDS

JOHN J. WALSH TROPHY

The John J. Walsh trophy was donated by the Downtown Seconds Club of Madison, Wisconsin. This trophy, named after the Wisconsin boxing coach, is a traveling award and is awarded annually to the team which scores the most points in the National Collegiate Boxing Championships. Method of computing team points follows: one point for each victory prior to semifinals, three points for each semi final victory, five points for each victory registered in the finals. The trophy was first awarded to Wisconsin in 1948.

DEWITT PORTAL TROPHY WINNERS

The DeWitt Portal Trophy was established in 1955 by the National Intercollegiate Boxing Coaches Association in honor of San Jose State's long-time coach, who died in an accident in September 1953. The trophy is awarded to the boxer in the National Collegiate Tournament "who exemplifies the sportsmanship and competitive spirit most desired in intercollegiate boxing."
