HISTORY

- 1978** At the 72nd NCAA Convention (January 1978) in Atlanta, the membership voted to establish the Division I-AA Football Championship and a statistics program for the division. The format for the first I-AA championship, held in Wichita Falls, Texas, was a single-elimination, four-team tournament. Florida A&M defeated Massachusetts, 35-28, in the title game. The game was televised by ABC.
- 1981** The championship expanded to include eight teams in a single-elimination tournament.
- 1982** The championship expanded to include 12 teams. Eight teams played first-round games at campus sites, and the top four teams, seeded by the Division I-AA Football Committee, received byes.
- 1986** The championship field expanded to its current format of 16 teams with each team playing a first-round game.
- 1987** Louisiana-Monroe defeated Marshall, 43-42, in the closest game in championship history.
- 1989** A then-record 25,725 fans watched Georgia Southern down Stephen F. Austin, 37-34, in the championship game at Allen E. Paulson Stadium in Statesboro, Georgia.
- 1990** Georgia Southern won its fourth I-AA championship, adding to its titles in 1985, 1986 and 1989.
- 1991** Youngstown State won its first national championship with a 25-17 victory over Marshall. Penguin head coach Jim Tressel joined his father, Lee, as the only father-son combination to win NCAA football titles. Lee Tressel won the 1978 Division III championship at Baldwin Wallace.
- 1992** A then-record crowd of 31,304 in Huntington, West Virginia, saw Marshall return the favor with a 31-28 win over Youngstown State for its first I-AA title.
- 1993** The I-AA championship provided for a maximum field of 16 teams. Six member conferences (Big Sky, Gateway, Ohio Valley, Southern, Southland and Yankee) were granted automatic qualification for their respective winners. Youngstown State won its second I-AA title with a 17-5 victory over Marshall before a crowd of 29,218 in Huntington, West Virginia.
- 1994** Youngstown State won its third national title in four years with a 28-14 victory over Boise State.
- 1995** Montana won its first Division I-AA title before a championship record crowd of 32,106 in Huntington, West Virginia.
- 1996** Marshall, making its fifth visit to the championship game since 1991, won its second Division I-AA title with a 49-29 victory over defending champion Montana before 30,052 in Huntington, West Virginia.
- 1997** Youngstown State won its fourth national title in the 1990s with a 10-9 victory over McNeese State in Chattanooga, Tennessee.
- 1999** Georgia Southern closed out the century with another national title, posting a 59-24 victory over Youngstown State. The Eagles won their fifth title, surpassing Youngstown State's four championships and taking over the division lead in crowns.
- 2000** Georgia Southern rallied past Montana, 27-25, to claim back-to-back titles for the third time in its Division I-AA history.
- 2001** Montana won a defensive duel with Furman, 13-6, to claim its second title.
- 2002** Western Kentucky won its first Division I-AA championship with a 34-14 victory over McNeese State, which lost in the final for the second time (1997 in 10-9 loss to Youngstown State). Coach Jack Harbaugh, father of former Chicago Bears and Indianapolis Colts quarterback Jim Harbaugh, won his first NCAA title.
- 2003** Delaware won its first NCAA crown since winning the 1979 Division II championship. The Blue Hens outscored their opponents by a combined margin of 149-23 and posted the first championship-game shutout with a 40-0 blanking of previously unbeaten Colgate. It was the first NCAA title for head coach and former Delaware linebacker K.C. Keeler, who had five second-place finishes at Division III Rowan.
- 2004** James Madison was the second straight champion to come out of the Atlantic 10 Conference, after defeating Montana, 31-21. The 2003 champion was Delaware. The Dukes also made history on their way to the championship game, becoming the first team to advance to the title contest with three straight wins on the road. James Madison won preliminary-round games at Lehigh, Furman and William and Mary.
- 2005** Appalachian State made it championship number eight for the Southern Conference as the Mountaineers rallied from a 16-7 halftime deficit to defeat the University of Northern Iowa, 21-16. The two teams played in front of a crowd of 19,219.

- 2006** Division I-AA became known as the Football Championship Subdivision and Division I-A became the Football Bowl Subdivision. Since the NCAA does not sponsor a championship for the FBS, the tournament to determine an FCS winner was called the Division I Football Championship. Appalachian State became the first repeat champion since Georgia Southern in 1999 and 2000. The Mountaineers scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to break a 14-14 tie and take a 28-17 victory over Massachusetts in front of a crowd of 22,808, the highest attendance in the championship's 10-year run in Chattanooga.
- 2007** Appalachian State became the first team to win three straight Division I football championships with a 49-21 win over Delaware in the title game. The attendance of 23,010 is the highest since the championship moved to Chattanooga.
- 2008** After knocking off three-time defending national champion Appalachian State in the quarterfinals, unseeded Richmond picked up its first Division I football national championship with a 24-7 victory over Montana in the title game. Under first-year coach and Richmond alumnus Mike London, the Spiders took a 21-0 lead into halftime and never looked back in finishing the season 13-3. Montana, making its second championship game appearance in the past five years and third in the past nine years, finished the year 14-2.
- 2009** Making its first Division I championship game appearance, Villanova fell behind 14-3 midway through the second quarter, but the Wildcats scored 20 straight points and held off Montana for a 23-21 victory. Montana finished as runner-up for the second straight season, the third time in six years and the fourth time since 2000. Villanova's Matt Szczur rushed for 159 yards on 14 carries and caught four passes for 68 yards. Szczur also rushed for two touchdowns, including a three-yard run with 11:04 in the game to clinch the victory.
- 2010** The championship expanded to 20 teams and the title game moved to Frisco, Texas, marking the first time it was hosted in a new venue since 1997. Eastern Washington overcame a 19-point deficit with 20 unanswered points in the final 16:48 of the contest to claim a 20-19 victory over Delaware in the championship game. On its final possession, Delaware had a chance as the Blue Hens drove the ball to the Eastern Washington 39-yard line. But, on fourth and 10, a pass play came up 1 yard short, allowing Eastern Washington to clinch its first national title.
- 2011** After winning five NCAA Division II national championships, North Dakota State claimed its first FCS title in 2011. After moving to the higher division in 2004, the Bison played in their first FCS playoffs in 2010 and won two games. Down 6-3 in the third quarter of the 2011 title game, Brock Jensen threw a touchdown pass after a successful fake punt for the first touchdown of the game. He added another in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard keeper after a long interception return. The Bison held on to beat top-seeded Sam Houston State, 17-6.
- 2012** North Dakota State became the first team to defend its title since Appalachian State won three straight from 2005 to 2007 by defeating Sam Houston State, 39-13, in a rematch of the 2011 tournament final. The sold-out game at FC Dallas Stadium marked the first time that the same two teams battled in consecutive years since Montana and Marshall did so in 1995 and 1996.
- 2013** North Dakota State became the first school since Appalachian State in 2005-07 to win three consecutive NCAA Division I football crowns. The Bison defeated Towson, 35-7, in front of 19,802 at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.
- 2014** North Dakota State became the first school ever to win four consecutive NCAA Division I titles. The Bison defeated Illinois State 29-27 in a thrilling matchup played in front of 20,918 fans at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.
- 2015** The Division I Football Championship set an all-time attendance mark of 258,066. North Dakota State became the first school ever to win five consecutive NCAA Division I titles. The Bison defeated Jacksonville State, 37-10, in front of a record Frisco crowd of 21,836 Toyota Stadium.
- 2016** James Madison ended the North Dakota State reign with a 27-17 win at Fargo in the semifinals en route to winning the 2016 championship. The number four seed won all four games by double digits, including the national championship game as the Dukes beat Youngstown State, 28-14, to win their second national football championship.
- 2017** North Dakota State and James Madison, the only two champions since 2011, finally played each other in the national championship game. This year, the Bison turned the table on the Dukes from 2016 and won its sixth title in seven years. After seeing James Madison end the Bison streak at five straight in 2016, North Dakota State hung on to win 17-13.
- 2018** North Dakota State made it two straight and seven out of eight years as the Bison finished a perfect 15-0. Led by most outstanding player Darius Shepherd, who had five catches for 125 yards and two touchdowns, North Dakota State defeated Eastern Washington 38-24. The Bison's seven NCAA football titles only trail Division III Mount Union's 13 titles.
- 2019** North Dakota State won its third consecutive title and eighth in the last nine years with a 28-20 win over James Madison. The Bison made history, becoming the first modern-era DI college football program to go 16-0 in a single season. Only 1894 Yale shares that honor. Freshman quarterback Trey Lance led North Dakota State and was named the most outstanding player after 166 rushing yards and a touchdown on 30 attempts. He was 6-for-10 in the air and finished the season without an interception. The Dukes snapped a 14-game win streak, completing the campaign at 14-2.
- 2020** Sam Houston clinched their first championship and a perfect record (10-0) with a thrilling 23-21 win over South Dakota St. Trailing 21-17 with 5:41 remaining in the championship game, Sam Houston drove 65 yards and scored the game-winning touchdown with :16 remaining. Head coach K.C. Keeler won his second title (Delaware 2003). Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the championship season was held in the spring and abbreviated with a bracket size of just 16.
- 2021** Toyota Stadium in Frisco, TX hosted the second FCS championship game in six months as North Dakota State continued extended their dominance into a new decade. The Bison scored on their first possession and never looked back, defeating Montana State 38-10. Hunter Luepke, who had 5 rushing touchdowns on the season coming into the game, ran in three and took home Most Outstanding Player honors. North Dakota State has now won nine of the last 11 titles.
- 2022** South Dakota State won their first football championship in their second appearance in the title game in the last three seasons. Mark Gronowski threw for 223 yards and three touchdowns to earn Most Outstanding Player to give North Dakota State their first loss in a title game in nine appearances. Head coach John Stiegelmeier went out on top, retiring after the game following 26 seasons leading the Jackrabbits.
- 2023** For the second straight year, South Dakota State won the national championship. Led again by MOP Mark Gronowski and new head coach Jimmy Rogers, the Jackrabbits ran the table in an undefeated season. The game pulled in 19,512 fans which was the highest attendance since 2015.
