





## Work plan for 2018 - 2019

In its work plan, the Working Group will focus and seek to –



Provide national and regional experiences and good practices including case studies in geospatial data generation to monitor "leaving no one behind";

Propose strategies for undertaking methodological work on specific areas for improving disaggregation by geographic location. In particular with a focus on national and sub-national reporting, in this regard, to report to the High-Level Group, Statistical Commission and Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management; and

Review options and provide guidance to the IAEG-SDGs on the role of National Statistical Offices in considering and applying geospatial information and earth observations primarily as a means to contribute to and validate data as part of official statistics.
