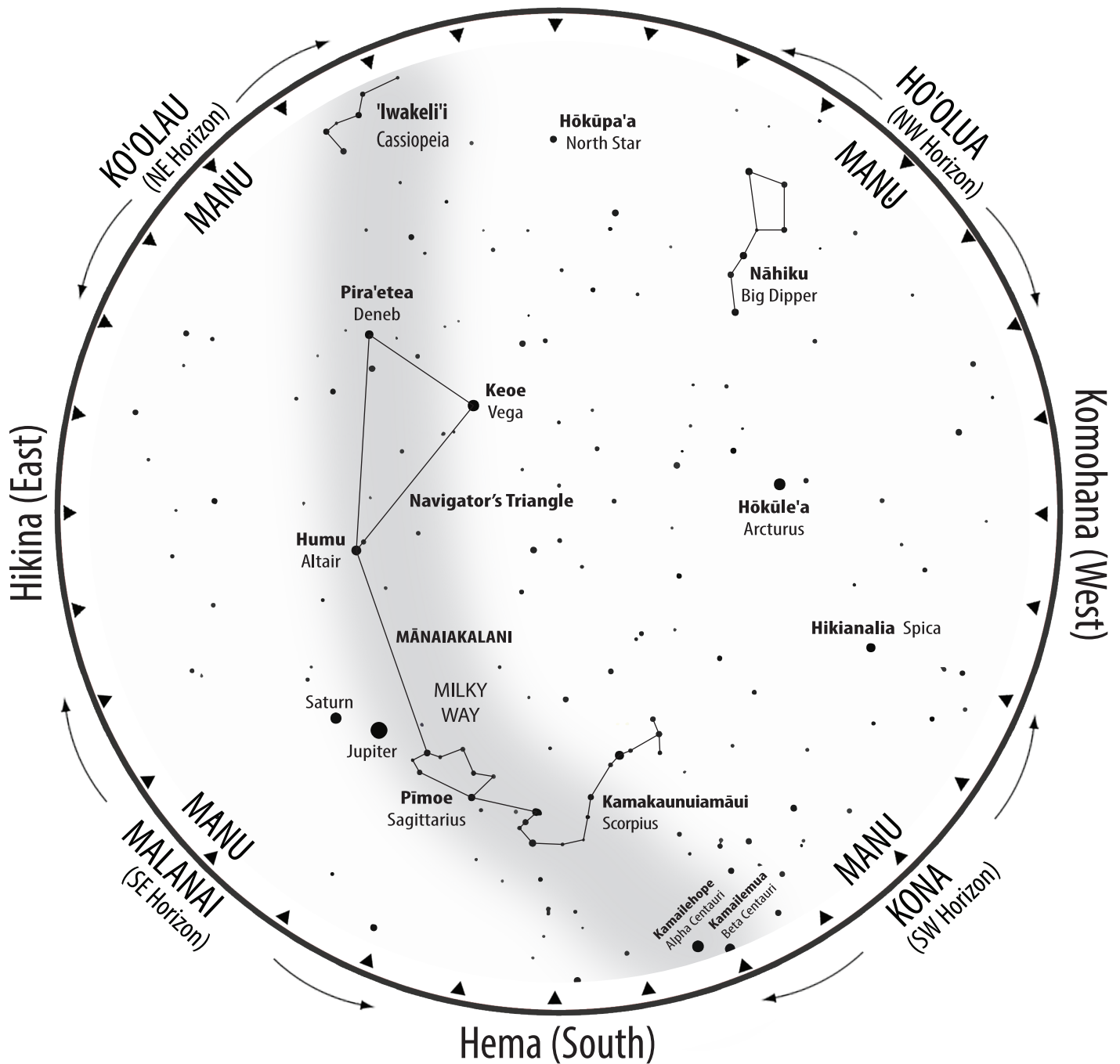


'Aukake | August Skies at 8pm

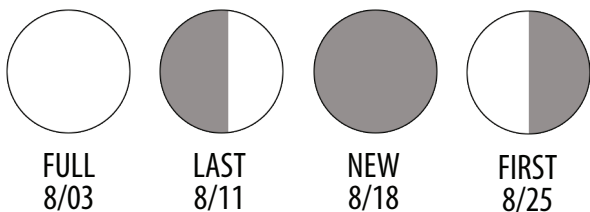
'Ākau (North)



This star chart incorporates the Hawaiian Star Compass and is oriented for an observer looking up and facing South. In this orientation, the Hikina (East) horizon is on the left and the Komohana (West) horizon is on the right.

This chart reflects the night sky over Hawai'i at 8pm.

August Moon Phases



August Highlights

- > **Persids Meteor Shower** - Every summer, our sky is decorated with the beautiful Persids meteor shower. This shower will be active from late July through Mid-August, with a peak of activity occurring on August 12 at about 3 a.m. HST. At its peak, we can expect 60-150 shooting stars per hour. The shooting stars will mostly be traveling across the sky from east to west.
- > **Jupiter & Saturn** - Jupiter and Saturn will both be prominent in the early evening sky. Jupiter will stand out in the early evening as one of the brightest objects in the sky while Saturn will be much fainter and to the east of Jupiter.
