Buy the produce with our black eagle, our union label, and you too will be a member of the United Farmworkers AFL-CIO. Unity is our strength!

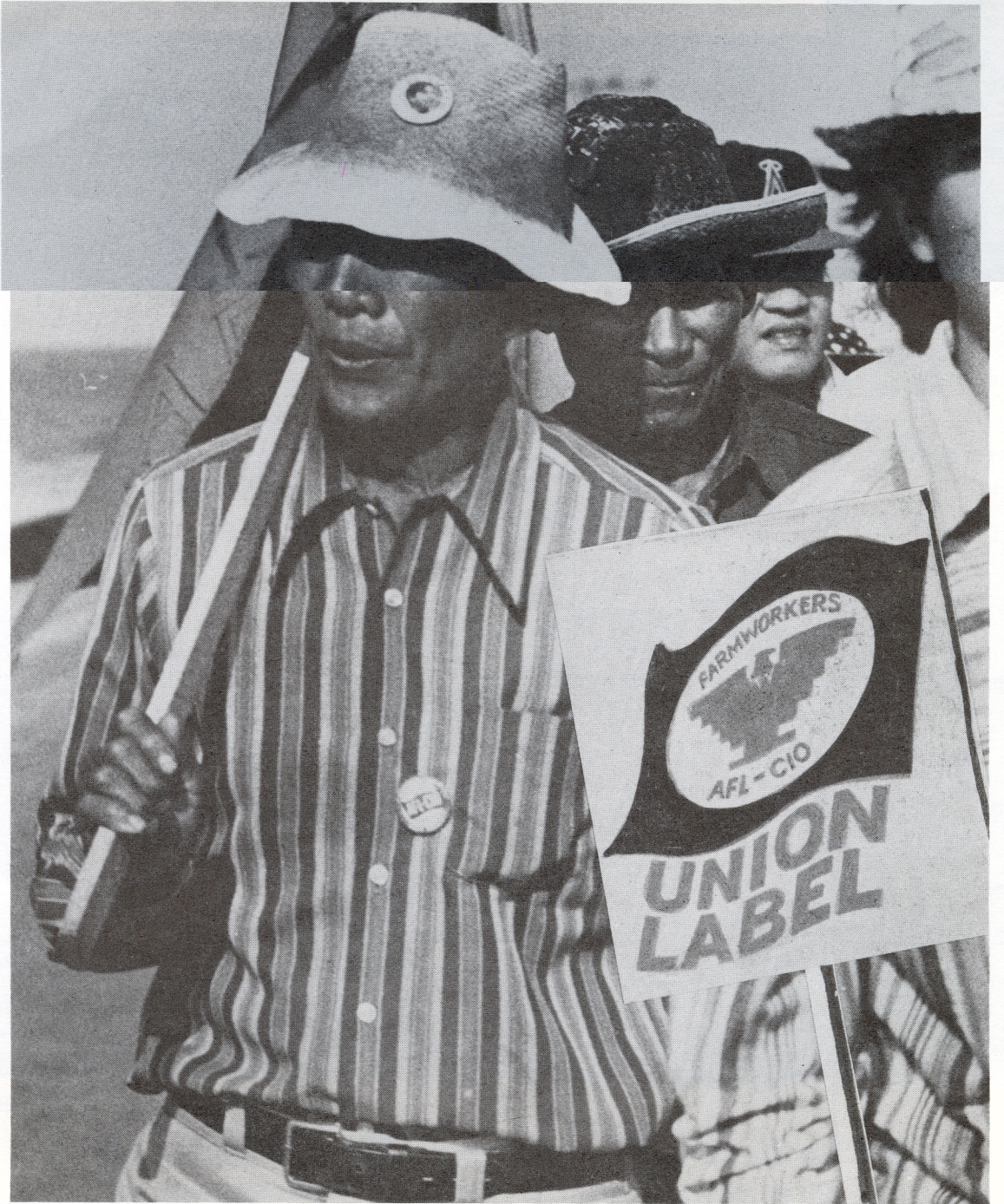
