## Education:

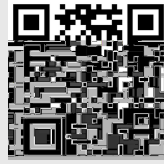
- Junior or senior undergraduates and first and second-year graduate students

## Core Roles and Responsibilities



- Monitor and analyze federal and state legislation impacting Latino communities
- Conduct research and update policy fact sheets for upcoming events
- Coordinate event logistics including panel organization, speaker materials, and registration
- Liaise with Congressional offices and agencies to support policy efforts and national LULAC events
- Contribute to research and writing for LULAC News, one of the longest-running Latino publications, continuously in circulation since 1931.
