## Education:

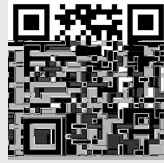
- Junior or senior undergraduates and first and second-year graduate students

## LULAC's Focus Areas

## Research and Policy Fellowship Program

The Fellowship Program empowers emerging leaders to address key issues in the Latino community. Fellows will be able to conduct independent research, explore career options, and learn from industry experts.



## Fellowship Details

- Commit a minimum of 26 hours per week for 8-10 weeks, with flexible scheduling options
- Based at the LULAC National Office in Washington, D.C.
- Please note that since these are unpaid internships, students will be required to secure either academic credit from their institution and/or an outside stipend

## Core Fellowship Roles and Responsibilities

- Conduct in-depth policy research on healthcare access, civic engagement, and technology, addressing intersections with immigration, socioeconomic barriers, and language challenges
- Write and prepare research manuscripts for peer-reviewed publication
- Liaise with Congressional offices and agencies to support LULAC's policy initiatives
- Assist in organizing and presenting research findings at seminars, webinars, and virtual meetings with LULAC council members and stakeholders
- Support grant writing for projects related to LULAC's core focus areas
- Lead 'Teach-in' seminars and attend policy events and hearings in Washington, D.C.
