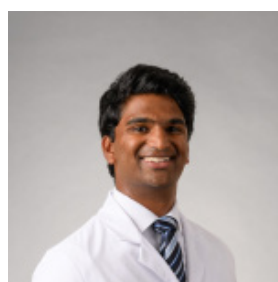
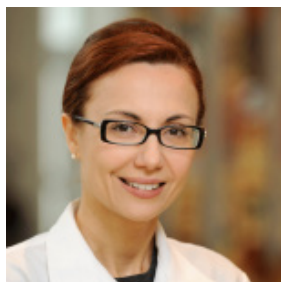
APBN Boards Passed

Misbah Azeem, MBBS, PGY 3

Communication Skills: “While he was working with our team on the BHU, he was a wonderful example of what I hope to see in off-service residents rotating through psychiatry. He took great care of his patients at every turn, but remained respectful and very willing to learn, a great balance to strike. His communication, whether with the physician team, nursing staff, patients or family members was wonderful- Respectful, professional, clear and empathetic. He was great with involving medical students in patient care, as well as teaching. During the month, there

were several patients who complained of minor neurological complaints, and Misbah helped us a great deal by reviewing neurological exams, helping us think through differentials, and offering level-appropriate teaching to our team. I was most impressed however at his persistent and genuine thirst to learn while on the service. Routinely, he would pose thoughtful, relevant questions about psychiatric differentials, diagnosis, treatments that had direct relevance to his future practice in neurology. 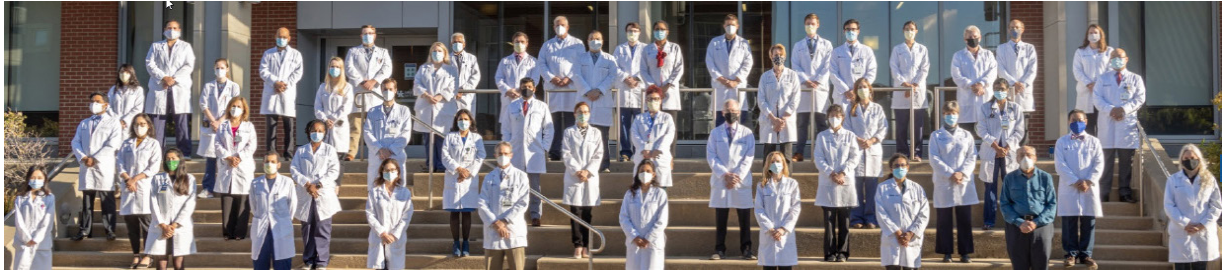

The Vicarious Trauma Toolkit

The *Vicarious Trauma Toolkit* (VTT) was developed on the premise that exposure to the traumatic experiences of other people—known as *vicarious trauma*—is an inevitable occupational challenge for the fields of victim services, emergency medical services, fire services, law enforcement, and other allied professionals; however, organizations can mitigate the potentially negative effects of trauma exposure by becoming vicarious trauma-informed.

Physician Support Line

The Ridge Behavioral System

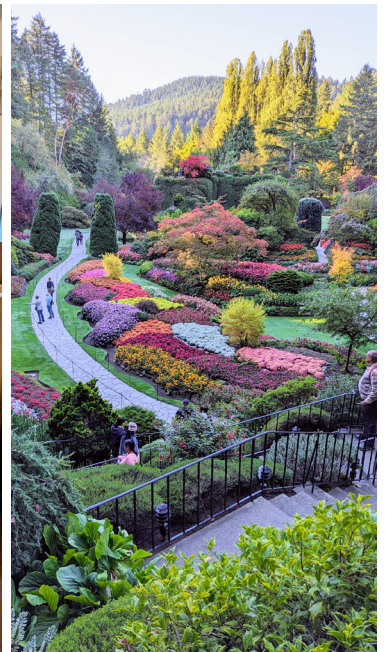
