

Kentucky was ranked <u>46</u> out of 50 states on health outcomes in 2021 by America's Health Rankings.








RNs and APRNs continue to be maldistributed across the state of Kentucky despite a 35% difference in population between rural and urban counties.

The majority of APRNs are Caucasian (93.6%), have a Master of Science in nursing (85%), work 32-40 hours a week, and work in an office/clinic setting (43.4%).

Other settings include long-term/extended care/rehab, nursing education, HMO/insurance company/managed care, public health/community health, primary/secondary school, industry, temporary staffing agency, Hospice/Home Health, military/federal/state facility, mental health facility, correctional facility, medical/pharmaceutical sales, self-employed/nurse consultant, assisted living, and non-nursing field.

Other populations of focus include midwife, adult, pediatric, women's health, gerontological, school, med/surgical, adult-psych/mental health, child/adolescent psych, neonatal, acute care, community health, critical care, and oncology.
