

- shu 熟 "cooked," referring to semi-acculturated peoples

- shui 水 water; name of a *minzu* in Guizhou

yamen 衙门 office of the imperial government, applied also to the office of a *tusi* 

Yan Huang zisun 炎黄子孙 children and grandchildren of the emperors Yan (Shen Nong) and Huang (the Yellow Emperor)

yatou 丫头 female household slave in Han society

Yi 彝 the name of a *minzu*"Yi bao" 彝胞 "Yi bros.," a
folksy, somewhat condescending
Han-language name for Nuosu
yifu 衣服 clothes

Yiwen ban 彝文班 class taught in the Nuosu language

Yiwen xuexiao 彝文学校 Yilanguage school Yizu chuantong zhishifenzi 彝族 传统知识分子 traditional Yi intellectuals

Yizu Hanzu shi liang jia 彝族汉族 是两家 "Yi and Han are two separate families"
