Reduce, reuse or recycle.

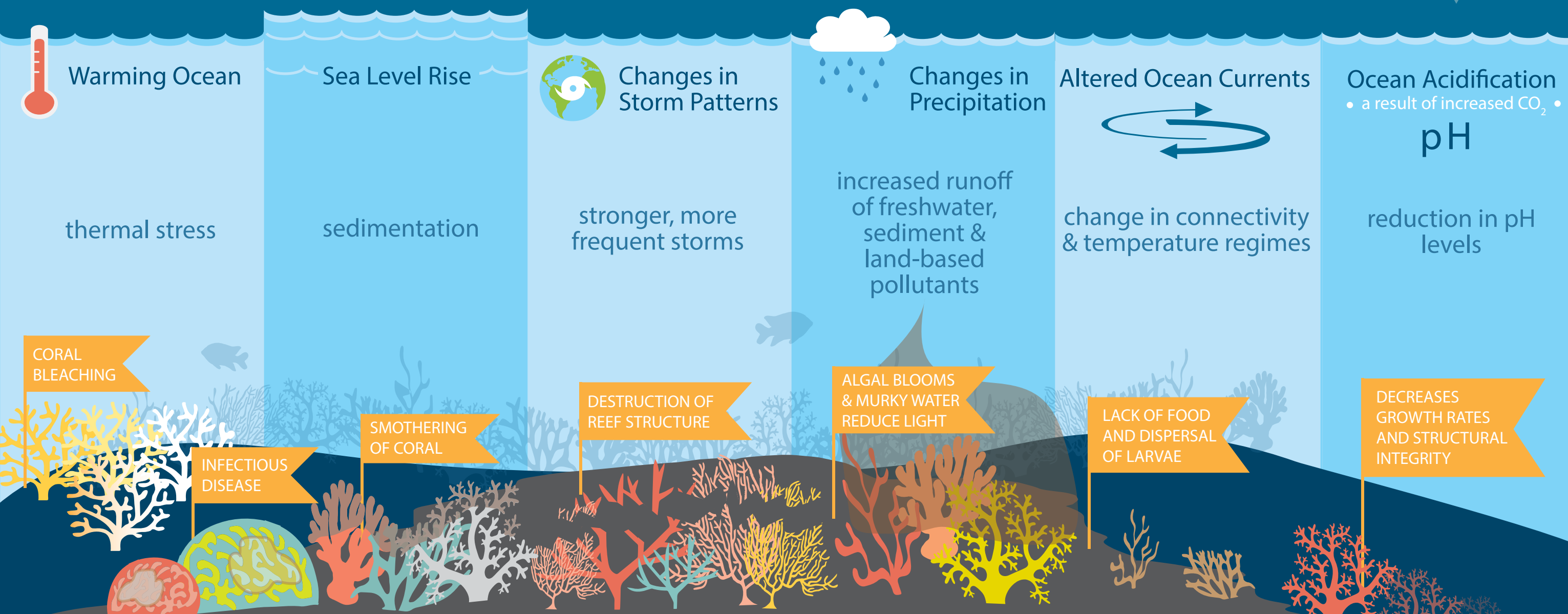


Purchase energy-efficient appliances and lightbulbs.
