Information/Instructions for Applicants Seeking Admission as a Spring or Summer Guest

GUEST STATUS IS AVAILABLE for Institute, Workshop, and Short Course participants enrolling for the Spring and/or Summer Half-term only. No application fee is required.

ITEMS REQUIRED TO PROCESS THIS APPLICATION:

- Completed Application
- The Code of Conduct (located on page 4).
- An applicant who is currently enrolled as a Graduate Student in another institution, and who expects to return to that institution, may use the "Guest from Another Graduate School" section on page 2 of the Guest Application (in lieu of providing a transcript).
- All other applicants must submit an official transcript with the bachelor's or master's degree posted.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS if you are currently enrolled as a graduate student at another U.S. institution, your SEVIS record will be maintained by that institution. If you are currently overseas and will be attending the U-M as a guest student, you will need to complete the Affidavit of Financial Support and submit the form with the required financial documentation. IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to read the Guidelines and to apply for admission and register under the correct residency classification. It is also the student's responsibility to file a Residency Application for an official determination of status if any of the criteria detailed in the Guidelines apply. COMPLETED APPLICATIONS should be submitted to the program who oversees the Institute, Workshop, and/ or Short Course for approval. Once the program approves the application they will send it to Rackham Admissions.

SHORTLY AFTER THE ADMISSION HAS BEEN APPROVED by the Institute/Workshop, the Graduate School issues an Admission Letter which should be taken with you to registration. Institute/Workshop staff advise the student regarding registration procedures.

- You currently live outside the state of Michigan for any purpose, including, but not limited to, education, volunteer activities, military service, travel, employment.
- You have attended or graduated from a college outside the state of Michigan.
- You have been employed or domiciled outside the state of Michigan within the last 3 years.
- You are not a U.S. citizen or Permanent Resident Alien (if you're a Permanent Resident Alien, you must have a Permanent Resident Alien card).
- Your spouse, partner or parent is in Michigan as a nonresident student, medical resident, fellow or for military assignment or other temporary
 employment.
- You are 24 years of age or younger and a parent lives outside the state of Michigan.
- You are 24 years of age or younger and have attended or graduated from a high school outside the state of Michigan.
- You have attended or graduated from an out-of-state high school and have been involved in education pursuits for the majority of time since high school graduation.
- You previously attended any U-M campus (Ann Arbor, Dearborn, or Flint) as a nonresident.

Other circumstances may also require you to file a residency application. For questions or assistance, contact the Residency Classification Office at (734) 764-1400.

The deadline dates for submitting an Application for Resident Classification apply to the term for which residency is sought and are as follows: September 30 for Fall Term, January 31 for Winter Term, July 31 for Spring, Spring/Summer and Summer Terms. Applications must be received by 5 p.m. on the deadline date. Applicants who do not file by the deadline date will be responsible for paying nonresident tuition. Processing times can be lengthy. It is recommended that applications be submitted as soon as possible.
