

MCC Scientist in Training Travel Award Information

Purpose of the award:

The Markey Cancer Center (MCC) is committed to furthering the research interests of young investigators and to developing their research skills through networking at national meetings. This program specifically supports the travel of MCC trainees to present an abstract at a national scientific conference or meeting.

Amount of the award:

Up to 12 awards of \$500 each will be funded yearly. Awards will be presented on a rolling basis throughout the academic year until funds are exhausted.

Eligibility:

Trainees are eligible to apply for this award provided he/she:

- Is an undergraduate student, graduate student, postdoctoral scholar, postdoctoral fellow, medical resident or medical fellow
- Works in the lab of and/or is mentored by a Cancer Center member or affiliate
- Is first author on an abstract selected for oral or poster presentation

How to Apply:

Email the completed application, meeting abstract, and official e-mail or invitation from the conference stating that you have been invited to present to Erin Oakley (erinjoakley@uky.edu) by the 15th day of the month prior to the month of travel.

Request a letter of support from primary mentor stating applicant's qualifications, contribution to the project, and how the travel experience will enhance the applicant's training and/or career. **Letters must be emailed directly to Erin Oakley from the mentor** by the 15th day of the month prior to the month of travel. Mentor letters should be no longer than one page (1/2 page preferred).

Criteria for selection of awardees:

Award recipients will be selected based on the scientific quality of the abstract, the relevance and significance of the research to the Cancer Center mission, as well as letter of support from primary mentor.

Additional Information:

Trainees may not receive more than one travel award per fiscal year.

If awarded, we ask that you acknowledge MCC for travel funds: *This research was supported by travel funding provided by the University of Kentucky Markey Cancer Center's Cancer Center Support Grant (P30 CA177558).*

All journal articles, manuscripts, or other peer-reviewed articles resulting from this travel award are required by NIH public access policy to obtain a PMCID upon publication. All publications should also contain an acknowledgement of support from the Cancer Center Research Grant and should acknowledge the specific Markey Shared Resource Facilities that aided in your research. We request that you provide outcome details of your abstract if your work results in a publication.
