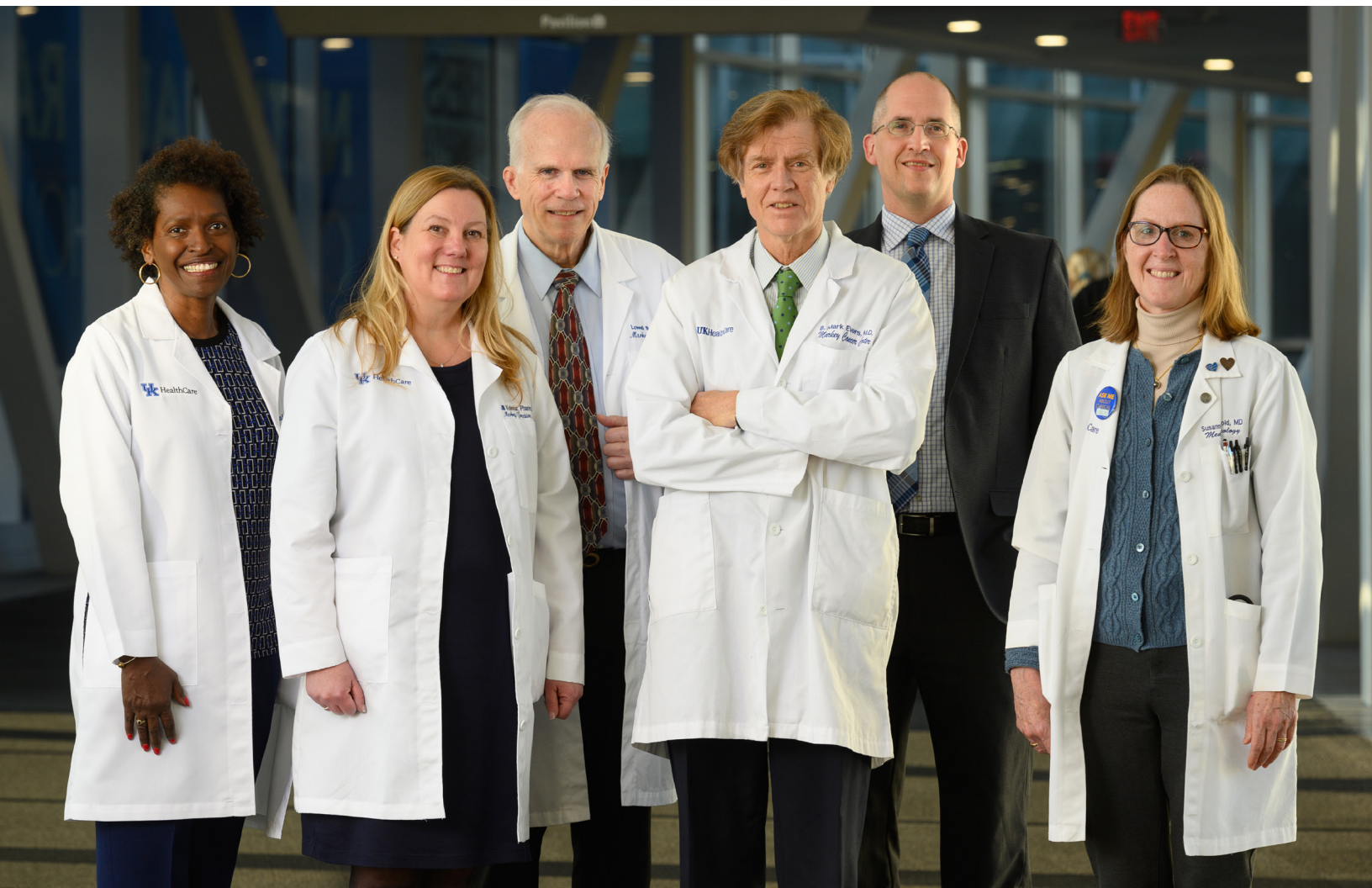

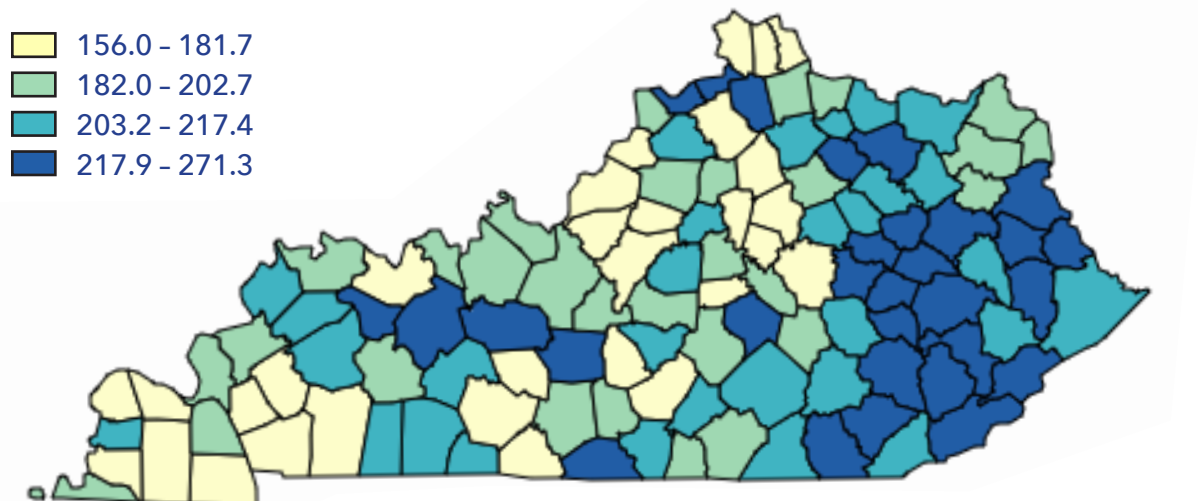
According to the Kentucky Cancer Registry based at the Markey Cancer Center, cancer is especially prevalent in eastern Kentucky where social conditions and access to healthcare further exacerbate our ability to prevent and treat the disease.

Regardless of where cancer strikes in Kentucky, the impact on families, communities, and our state is devastating. In addition to the enormous toll on the lives of Kentuckians, it's also a drag of billions of dollars on Kentucky's economy.

MARKEY IS AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

Out of 71 National Cancer Institute (NCI) designated cancer centers in America, Kentucky only has ONE – the Markey Cancer Center. This designation recognizes Markey for meeting rigorous standards for transdisciplinary, state-of-the-art research focused on developing new and better approaches to preventing, diagnosing, and treating cancer. By translating scientific knowledge from the research laboratory into new cancer treatments, Markey can provide better care for people across the state.

But it's more than just status. It allows Markey to compete for some of the best oncologists in the world, conduct high-level research through major federal grants, and attain an even higher level of cancer treatment for Kentuckians battling this horrible disease.

PURSUIING NCI COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CENTER STATUS

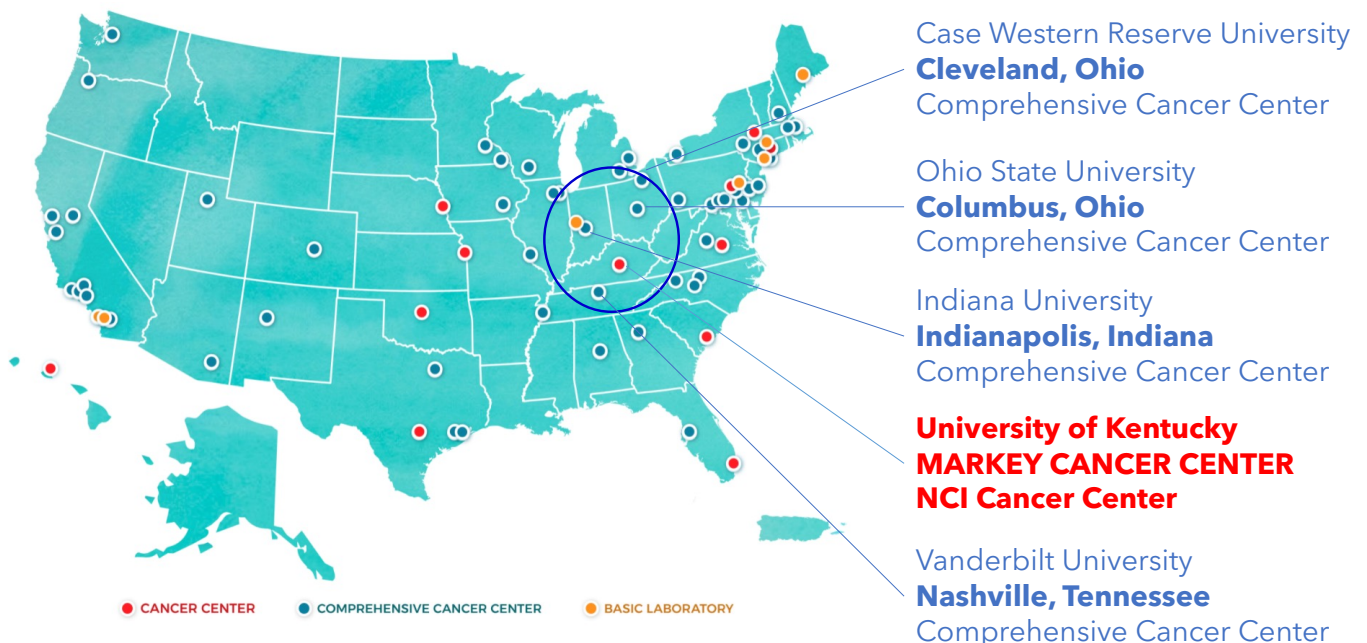
Under the leadership of Dr. Mark Evers, the Markey Cancer Center is poised to elevate its ground-breaking cancer research and patient care to world-class standards and recognition by pursuing National Cancer Institute Comprehensive Status, which will place us in the top 2% of U.S. cancer centers according to the American College of Surgeons, Commission on Cancer.

NCI comprehensive designation will mean that Markey excels in all four of NCI's standards for excellence: cancer prevention, clinical services, research, and training and education. This elevated status would allow Markey the opportunity to receive more federal grant funding, recruit nationally and internationally recognized oncologists and investigators, serve more patients, and have increased community engagement.

Markey's pursuit of this enhanced designation will demonstrate a strong institutional commitment to its clinical research strategy, organizational capacity, and facilities that ensure that no Kentuckian will have to cross state lines to get access to world-class cancer treatment. Additionally, this elite designation will bring many additional millions in research grants and other federal funding to the University of Kentucky.

Achieving this highest level in NCI designation is within reach, but Dr. Evers needs your help.

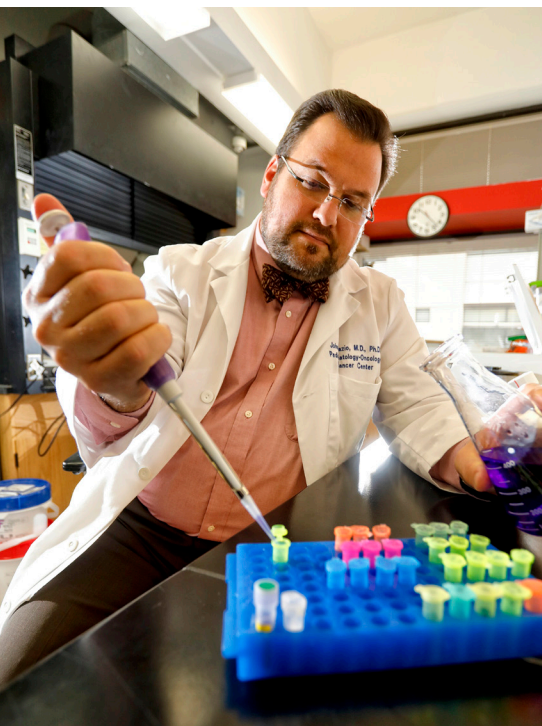
OUR FACILITIES

Further evidence of the institutional commitment to excellence is the building of a new facility for patient care and clinical research that creates a convenient, centralized home to offer world-class treatment. The new building will double patient capacity, ensure comfort and capable care close to home, and expand Markey's research footprint to pursue insights into the biology of cancer and translate that knowledge into treatments that reduce Kentucky's cancer burden.

OUR FUTURE

While the Markey Cancer Center is focused every day on beating cancer and saving lives, they are also focused on growing the next generation of world-class physicians and scientists right here in Kentucky.

An important facet of Markey's pursuit of NCI Comprehensive Status includes the Appalachian Career Training in Oncology Program, known as ACTION. It is designed to increase enrollment in post-secondary, professional, and/or graduate science degree programs and instill in students a lifelong commitment to research, education/ outreach, and health care careers.



ENDOWED FACULTY POSITIONS

To attract and retain the world's top faculty and staff members to Lexington, as well as recognize and reward them for their achievements, the Markey Cancer Center must significantly increase its funding of endowed faculty positions.

An essential component of the world's top academic cancer centers is endowed positions for salary stipends, professional support, and/or research. With this support, Markey researchers and clinicians are able to excite learning, perform innovative research, create global research cooperatives and service opportunities, and make discoveries that improve the quality of life for cancer patients and their families.

Endowments, which are permanently invested and generate annual spending distributions, are integral to building permanent and sustainable funding to support the mission of the Markey Cancer Center, now and in the future. These highly coveted endowed positions play a central role in retaining and attracting clinician scientists and are commonly offered by institutions competing with Markey for talent.

APPALACHIAN CAREER TRAINING IN ONCOLOGY (ACTION) PROGRAM

Appalachia has the grimmest health statistics in the Commonwealth, due in part to low access to health care. Furthermore, few eastern Kentucky students go on to study medical sciences with the goal of supporting their community. The Appalachian Career Training in Oncology (ACTION) Program is changing that and has already experienced some early victories. Through this unique program, the Markey Cancer Center engages high school and undergraduate students from among the 54 Appalachian Kentucky counties to participate in research experiences, career

training and coaching, peer-to-peer networking and learning, mentored cancer research projects, cancer care experiences, as well as hands-on outreach opportunities with an emphasis on the participants' own Appalachian communities. Students are challenged to focus on the cancer burden in Appalachian Kentucky and beyond; enhance the community's understanding of cancer prevention research and clinical care, and linking these facets to the benefits of science education.

The combination of unique cancer and socioeconomic disparities and underrepresentation in education attainment in this part of the Commonwealth underscores the significant need for educational, workforce preparedness, and health literacy intervention strategies for this population.

There are two investment opportunities to support the ACTION Program:

NAMED ACTION PROGRAM ENDOWMENT

(\$3 million)

Donors are invited to consider creating a named endowment to provide permanent and sustainable support for the ACTION Program that will enhance and sustain its impact on Appalachian Kentucky in perpetuity.

ACTION PROGRAM SUPPORT

(\$500,000)

Donors are invited to make outright gifts to defray the annual costs of supporting the ACTION Program.



COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CENTER BUILDING

A cornerstone of Markey's commitment to winning the battle against cancer is the construction of a new state-of-the-art Comprehensive Cancer Center Building to offer world-class patient care, research, and clinical facilities. This new centralized facility will serve as a major driver of clinical growth and early phase trials that address the unmet needs of Kentuckians dealing with all forms of cancer and offer them the most innovative cancer treatments available.

A key component of the new building is the Precision Medicine Center which is dedicated to providing patients with increased access to phase I and phase II clinical trials. Kentuckians will have access to novel treatments and drug therapies that are rarely available to patients treated outside an NCI-designated cancer center such as Markey. Cancer patients who are enrolled in early phase clinical trials will receive much of their care in this new space staffed by a specialized and dedicated team of clinicians.

The Precision Medicine Center will serve patient referrals for unique trials and treatment options from UK

HealthCare physicians, as well as physicians from across the Commonwealth.

This new building will also serve as the new expanded home for the Markey Cancer Center and the Markey Cancer Foundation.
