#### **Summary**

No significant flooding occurred during the month of May. Minor river flooding carried over from April into May on the Grand, Maple, and Thornapple Rivers in our Hydrologic Service Area (HSA). River flood advisories were issued for several rivers in our HSA when river levels were forecast to exceeded bankfull but not reach flood stage. Areal flood advisories were issued for Eaton, Calhoun, Ingham and Jackson Counties. Spotters reported heavy rain, elevated stream levels, and minor ponding of water over roads during the areal flood advisory events. No lives were lost and no significant property damage occurred during these flood events.

#### **General Hydrologic Information**

May 2009 will be remembered for near normal temperatures and below normal precipitation for most of our area except for the Lansing and Jackson, Michigan areas. May precipitation totals at Grand Rapids, Lansing, and Muskegon, Michigan, were 2.65, 4.08, and 1.65 inches, respectively. Precipitation totals for the month at these three sites were 0.70 of an inch below normal at Grand Rapids, 1.37 inches above normal at Lansing, and 1.30 inches below normal at Muskegon, Michigan. Yearly precipitation totals were 2.93 inches above normal for Grand Rapids, 5.83 inches above normal for Lansing, and 3.87 inches above normal for Muskegon, Michigan.

No Snow was recorded during the month of May at Grand Rapids, Lansing, or Muskegon, Michigan.

Temperatures for the month of May were near normal at Grand Rapids, Lansing, and Muskegon, with average monthly departures of +0.2, +0.1 and -0.1 degrees Fahrenheit, respectively.
