Several rounds of heavy rain resulted in above normal rainfall for much of the region. The greatest departures were in the Kalamazoo and portions of the upper Grand Basin. Minor flooding occurred in these regions.

General Hydrologic Information

The month of May featured above normal precipitation. The greatest departures were along the Kalamazoo River Basin with some locations over 200 percent above normal.




Figure 1. May 2018 Monthly Precipitation Totals




Figure 2. May 2018 Percent of Mean of Accumulated Precipitation

May precipitation for Grand Rapids, Lansing, and Muskegon, Michigan, was 5.64, 4.97, and 4.62 inches, respectively (Figure 1). Monthly departures were 1.66, 1.61 and 1.37 inches respectively. Yearly departures were 3.12, 4.37, and 3.70 inches for Grand Rapids, Lansing and Muskegon respectively. Percent of mean precipitation for May 2018 is shown in Figure 2.

Temperatures for the month of May were well above normal at Grand Rapids, Lansing and Muskegon. The average monthly temperature departures for these sites were 6.1, 7.0 and 5.9 degrees Fahrenheit respectively.

Accumulated Precipitation (in) May 1, 2018 to May 31, 2018

Accumulated Precipitation: Percent of Mean May 1, 2018 to May 31, 2018
