The Northern Spotted Owl is one of many endangered species in Washington State whose livelihood largely depends on environmental justice. Protection efforts date back to the 1950's with Supreme Court Justice William (Bill) Douglas, forty years prior to adoption of the Northwest Forest Plan, which guides conservation efforts for owl habitat.

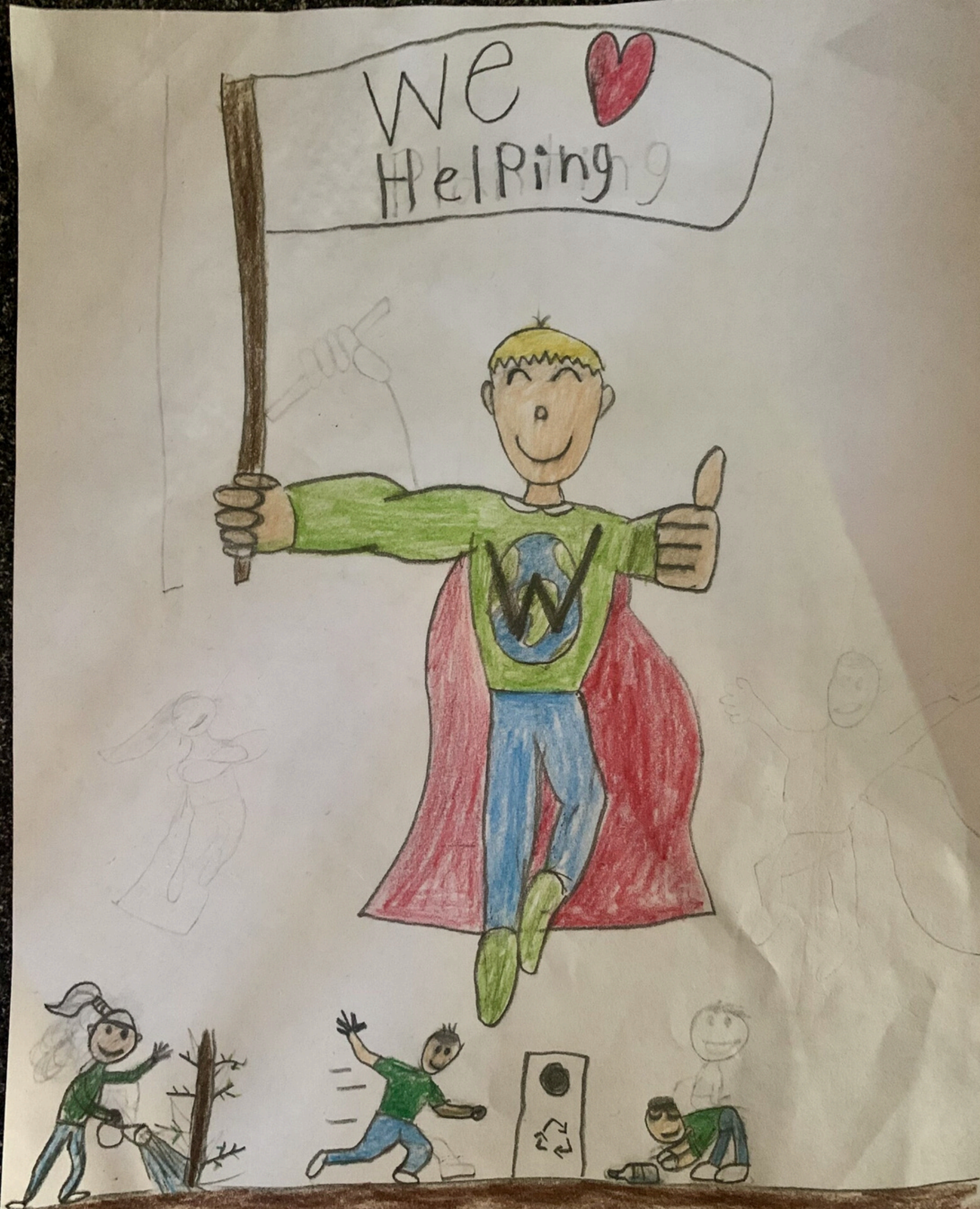

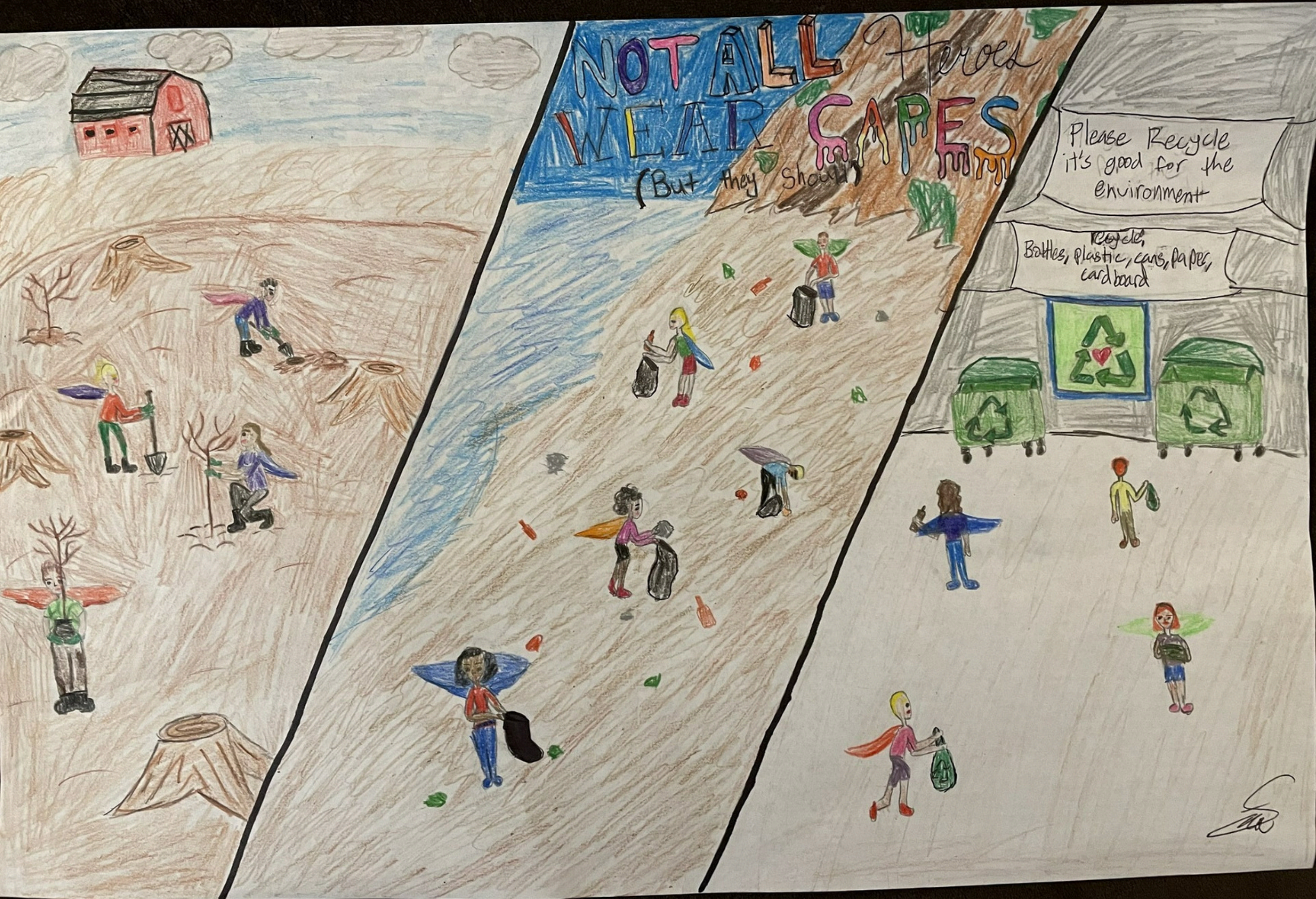

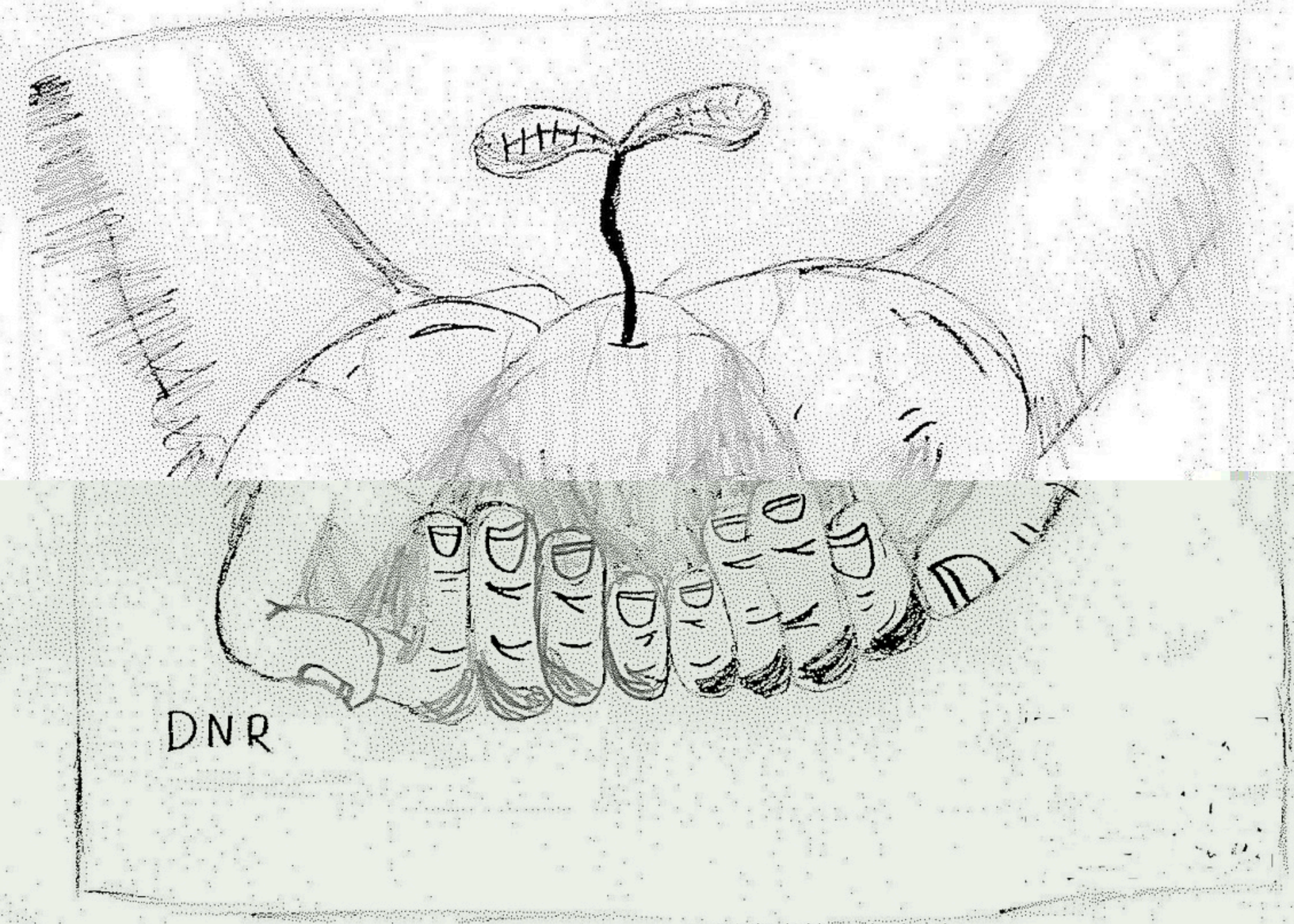

European Green Crab

IMPACT:
Negative impacts to beneficial crab, clam, and oyster populations

LAST SEEN:
Washington's Pacific Coast and Puget Sound

Emerald Ash Borer

IMPACT:
Destroying entire forests of ash trees as a wood-boring beetle.

LAST SEEN:
Across forests and riparian zones in Washington State.

WANTED
= INVASIVE SPECIES =



Zebra Mussel

IMPACT:
Destroying boat engines & props, and nearly eradicating native mussels

LAST SEEN:
Clinging onto the bottoms of vessels, anchors, & even onto native mussels

UNWANTED

Eurasian Watermilfoil

IMPACT:
Creating surface mats, crowding out beneficial plants, and impeding recreation

LAST SEEN:
Lakes throughout Washington

WANTED

Northern Giant Hornet

IMPACT:
Attacking native honeybee nests

LAST SEEN:
Building nests in North Washington
