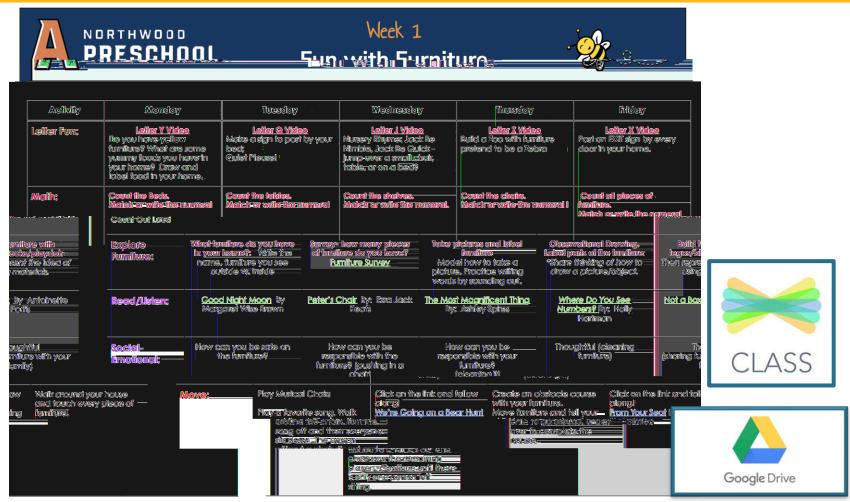


Giraffes Can't Dance Choice Board

Adaptive:	Take your own shoes and socks off and dance barefoot. Now put them back on.	Practice washing your hands. Hand Washing	Pick up 3 toys and put them away while acting like a tall giraffe.
