Accessibility

The FCC's Disability Rights Office helps to improve accessibility for people with disabilities through the following:

- Closed captioning on television and the internet
- E-mail, text messaging, internet chat, and other advanced communication services
- Emergency information on television
- Hearing aid compatible phones
- Internet browsers built into mobile phones
- Real-time text
- Telecommunications relay services
- Telephone services and equipment
- Television and set-top box controls, menus, and program guides
- Video described programs on television
