GREEN STURGEON ARE PROTECTED BY FEDERAL LAW

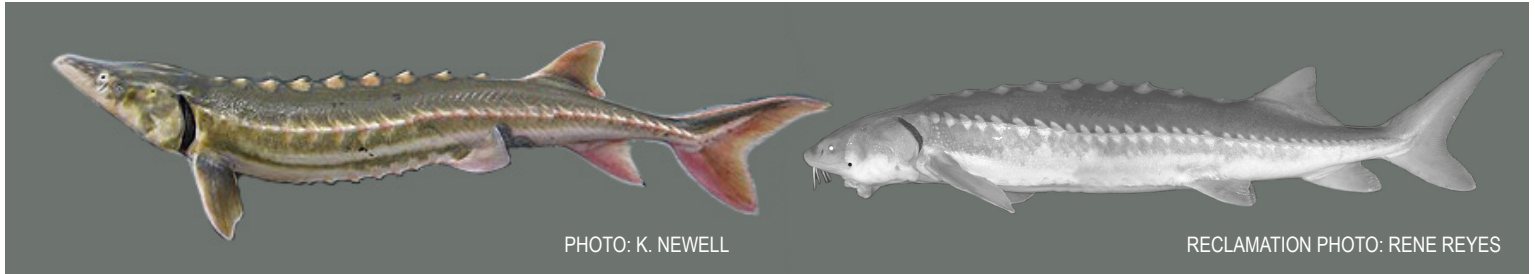

GREEN STURGEON

- 8-11 sharp dorsal scutes
- Scutes behind vent
- Olive green to dark green back
- Dark stripe on each side and on belly
- Vent is located *between* the pelvic fins

WHITE STURGEON

- 11-14 dull dorsal scutes
- No scutes behind vent
- Gray back shading into a white belly
- No dark stripe on sides or belly
- Vent is located *behind* the pelvic fins

If you accidentally hook a green sturgeon be prepared to catch and release with care.

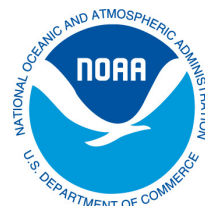
- **DON'T** remove a green sturgeon from the water.
- **DON'T** use a snare or gaff.
- **DON'T** play the fish to exhaustion.
- Remove your hook quickly and release the sturgeon immediately.
- Hold the sturgeon facing the current until they are able to swim away.

Improper handling of a green sturgeon may result in enforcement action.
