

Important Notice - Changes to Registration for Practice of Telehealth

If you are registered to practice telehealth in Vermont as an MD, physician assistant, or podiatrist, and do not hold a full license, pay careful attention to this notice. You need to act to legally practice telehealth with Vermont patients after July 31, 2024. As of August 1, 2024, you will need to hold a Vermont medical license, Vermont telehealth license, or a Vermont telehealth registration issued after May 1, 2024, to practice telehealth with Vermont patients.



Vermont, like most states, enacted emergency provisions during the COVID-19 pandemic that facilitated practice by professionals who were licensed in other states. Those emergency provisions were extended a number of times. Eventually the Vermont General Assembly passed a law creating new options for telehealth licensure and for a new and different form of telehealth registration, for most health care professions. The law is found in [Chapter 56 of Title 26, Vermont Statutes Annotated](#). For professions regulated by the Board of Medical Practice, July 31, 2024 is the last day a person may practice pursuant to one of the temporary registrations created for the COVID-19 emergency.
