WHAT WE DO

HUMAN RESOURCES SUPPORT

- **Talent Recruitment** - American Job Centers (AJCs) assist in recruiting talent and holding job fairs.
- **Veterans Services** - Representatives work with businesses to hire veterans and transitioning military personnel.
- **Federal Bonding Program** - Helps businesses hire job seekers with gaps in job history.
- **Work Opportunity Tax Credit Program** - An employer tax credit to hire Marylanders with employment barriers.
- **Maryland Workforce Exchange (MWE)** - State job bank where businesses can post jobs to recruit candidates.
- **Labor Market Information (LMI)** - Online tools to research updated information on unemployment and wages.

TRAINING AND ON-THE-JOB EXPERIENCE

- **Registered Apprenticeships** - Offers employers the tools to develop a highly-skilled workforce to help grow their businesses.
- **Apprenticeship Maryland Program (AMP)** - Gives businesses the opportunity to train school students into top-performing employees.
- **Maryland Business Works** - Helps employers upskill their workforce by providing funds for classroom-based training, in-house staff training, GED® Preparation, and more.
- **Employment Advancement Right Now (EARN)** - A grant program that provides career advancement for workers, leading to a more highly skilled workforce and improved business outcomes for employers.
- **Rapid Response Services** - Assists employers and workers with workforce reductions and provides employers with information to avert layoffs.

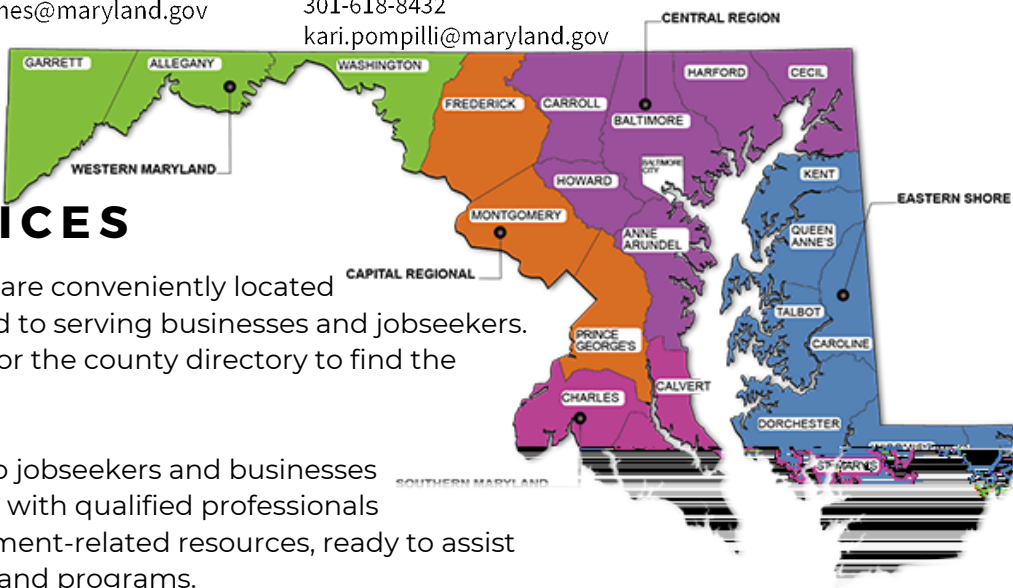
OVERVIEW OF JOBSEEKER SERVICES
