



IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR NEW HAMPSHIRE

Grants to New Hampshire Organizations and Individuals for Fiscal Year 2019 through 2023 – \$ 8,323,658

Total Number of Awards – 40

Award Highlights:

- Funding was awarded to Plymouth State University to initiate a two-year project that will support the creation of teaching materials, a sustainability lecture series, and a humanities course.
- Dartmouth College received a grant to conduct research and create a book on how the daily lives of people living in Japanese base towns were impacted by the American military's presence in Japan and Okinawa during the occupation (1945–1952) and the Korean War (1950–1953).

NEH also provides annual funding to the [New Hampshire Humanities Council](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent New Hampshire Humanities Highlights:

- NHH reached Granite Staters in their communities through programs like the Humanities Roadshow, a region-by-region celebration of the many ways of telling the story of the state. The Community Project Grant program supported creative projects highlighting local history including the Historical Society of Cheshire County's original documentary, *Jennie B. Powers: The Woman Who Dares*, which explored the progressive reformer Jennie Powers' trailblazing work with the Keene Humane Society between 1903 and 1936; the film was broadcast to local and regional audiences through special programs, school events and via New Hampshire Public Broadcasting, and streamed online for national and world audiences.
