Good morning Charlotte,

Jennifer Schultz from our Endangered Species Division is leading the NOAA Fisheries portion of the proposed rule to list distinct population segments of green sea turtles. She and her FWS colleagues are looking for information on all DoD INRMPs that include green sea turtles, so they are aware of them as they consider critical habitat proposals. Could you add the below request to the agenda for our quarterly call later this month? She's sending it out to contacts she has as well, but we wanted to reach as many DoD natural resource managers as possible.

The National Marine Fisheries Service the US Fish and Wildlife Service (together, the Services) are discussing potential critical habitat for our proposed green sea turtle distinct population segments. We have not yet identified critical habitat areas, but before we do, we would like to know what Integrated Natural Resources Management Plans (INRMPs) are available for green turtles. Under the Endangered Species Act, we do not designate critical habitat on DoD areas where we conclude that an INRMP provides a benefit to the species:

(B)(i) The Secretary shall not designate as critical habitat any lands or other geographical areas owned or controlled by the Department of Defense, or designated for its use, that are subject to an integrated natural resources management plan prepared

under section 101 of the Sikes Act (16 U.S.C. 670a), if the Secretary determines in writing that such plan provides a benefit to the species for which critical habitat is proposed for designation (16 U.S.C. 1533(a)(3)(B)(i).
