National Marine Fisheries Service together with US Fish and Wildlife Service are starting the process to designate critical habitat for green sea turtles (they just proposed 11 DPSs for listing under the Endangered Species Act).

NMFS is looking for any data or INRMPs that they should consider when identifying areas important to green turtles and for consideration of excluding any areas where the INRMP provides a benefit to the species. USFWS will be considering the nesting beaches and is focused on Florida, Guam, Hawaii and the CNMI and are looking for data as well.

Please let me know ASAP if you your INRMPs cover green sea turtles or if it does not cover green sea turtles but should.
