

Aurora borealis (northern lights) and aurora australis (southern lights) are the result of excited electrons colliding with surrounding gases in the atmosphere. Once they settle down to a lower energy state, the excess energy is released in the form of light. The brilliant colors produced depend on what kind of gas the electrons collide with.
