2025 Water Payments

Your 2025 irrigation bills will be arriving soon. To avoid late fees, be sure to make your payments by Dec. 6. Late fees begin accruing by 1% of any unpaid charges on Jan. 7. For payments made through online banking, be sure to update your payee address to SRP, P.O. Box 2952, Phoenix, AZ 85062-2952. 78%

As of Sept. 16, 2024, the SRP reservoir system was **78%** full at **1,789,978** acre-feet in storage. A year ago, the total system was **87%** full. On the Salt River system, we have four reservoirs: Roosevelt, Apache, Canyon and Saguaro lakes. On the Verde River system, we have two reservoirs: Horseshoe and Bartlett.

The Katy Pickrell, a significant dredge named after the wife of a former SRP president, holds a unique place in SRP's history. The vessel was built to keep thousands of tons of sand and silt from flowing into the canals. If this sand went into the canals, it would affect many miles of waterways across the Valley, requiring canals to be drained and cleaned more often.
