| <b>Early 1800s to January 1, 1874</b><br>(Temperature 1820 & Precipitation 1826)   | From reports of the Regents of New York University temperature and precipitation data were compiled with the following exceptions: temperature data August-December 1858, 1859, 1861, 1871, 1872 and 1873 were taken from the private records of Dr. Phillip Ten Eyck. |
| <b>December 22, 1873 to July 1, 1874</b>   | Signal Services, U.S. Army opened first weather reporting station to be sponsored by the Federal Government in Albany at the Dudley Observatory on Dudley Heights  |
| <b>July 1, 1874 to March 13, 1880</b>  | move to new building on the grounds of the Dudley Observatory which was constructed for the purpose by the trustees of the observatory near the first location of the station  |
| <b>March 13, 1880 to October 1, 1884</b>   | S.K. Grey's Building (4 <sup>th</sup> floor) 42-44 State Street Albany   |
| <b>October 1, 1884 to April 18, 1935</b>   | U.S. Custom House and Post Office Albany   |
| <b>April 18, 1935 to June 1, 1938</b>  | New Post Office Building at Broadway and Maiden Lane Albany  |
| <b>June 1, 1938 to present</b>   | Albany Airport Station at the Albany International Airport   |

**On February 9, 1870 President Ulysses S. Grant signed a joined resolution of Congress authorizing the Secretary of War to establish a national weather service.** This resolution required the Secretary of War "to provide for taking meteorological observations at the military stations in the interior of the continent and at other points in the States and Territories and for giving notice on the northern (Great) Lakes and on the seacoast by magnetic telegraph and marine signals, of the approach and force of storms."
