


Winter Weather Returns Today

Increasing Impacts This Afternoon and Tonight

Key Messages

- → Winter Weather Advisory from 11AM today until 11AM Saturday
 - ♦ I-80 Corridor from the Summit to Kimball County
- → Most Likely Scenario: (60% Probability)
 - ◆ Wet snow accumulations of 3-5" in the advisory area, with locally 6+"
- → High End Scenario: (40% Probability)
 - Widespread 5-8" along the I-80 corridor from the Summit to the Kimball County
 - Accumulating snow spilling into the Laramie Valley, southern Platte/Goshen, Banner, and Cheyenne counties







Snowfall Accumulation

Forecast Snowfall Totals Tonight through 5pm Saturday








Considerable Uncertainty Remains

This outlook depicts timing and magnitude of potential impacts to local travel and infrastructure from snowfall rates and/or amounts, blowing snow, ice, and cold temperatures.

Potential aggravating factors such as time of day, pre-existing conditions, and holiday travel periods are also taken into consideration.
