

Regional Climate Summary

April 2022

This April was one of the warmest, driest, and windiest on record for many locations across West TX and southeast NM. Daily high temperatures were mainly 5 to 10 degrees above normal and many cities had an average monthly temperature that ranked amongst the top 10 warmest. To make matters worse, little to no precipitation accumulated across the region, exacerbating the ongoing drought. Numerous dry and windy days set the stage for an active fire weather pattern throughout the month. Notable wildfires occurred on the 12th in Andrews and Mitchell Counties. A few structures and vehicles were lost as a result. Isolated severe weather also occurred near the end of the month. One storm caused significant flooding and large hail in Big Spring on the 24th.
