
Regional Climate Summary





August 2018

August began with hot, dry, and relatively quiet weather. A pattern change occurred on the 10th-11th which led to rounds of heavy rain across the Permian Basin, Midland International Air & Spaceport received a record daily rain total of 1.83" on the 11th. The Big Bend Region also received significant rainfall which caused minor flooding along the Rio Grande. Another quiet stretch of days with above normal temperatures occurred until the 27th when severe storms with 60 mph wind and torrential rain rocked the Midland/Odessa area. To summarize. this August was warmer than normal and very wet in some areas.
