

Regional Climate Summary

February 2023

Midland/Odessa, TX
Issued March 5, 2023 3:40 AM CT



This February featured both fire and ice. The month began with an ice storm across eastern portions of the region. Freezing rain accumulated on trees and elevated surfaces. Heavy rain also fell across the Big Bend region with some locations receiving over 1.00". Another storm system arrived on the 9th-10th. This system brought snow to the Permian Basin. Midland International Airport recorded 0.1" of snowfall on the 9th. The upper level pattern remained volatile through the end of the month with many storm systems passing through the region. The majority of these systems brought strong winds and blowing dust. A wind storm swept across the area on the 26th damaging trees and powerlines and starting a fire in the Davis Mountains which burned for several days.

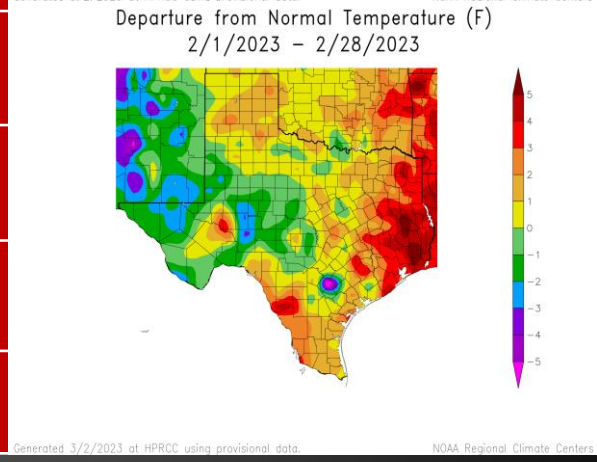
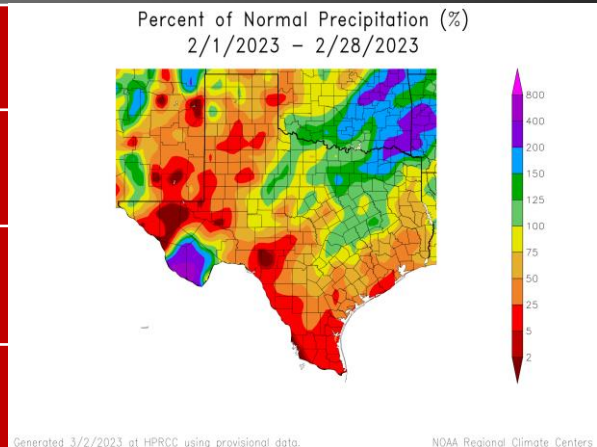
