

Regional Climate Summary

January 2020

This January was quite warm around West Texas and southeast New Mexico. Average temperatures ranged from 2-5°F above normal with some of the warmest locations including Fort Stockton, Hobbs, and Midland. Each of these cities recorded their top 10 warmest January temperatures. Despite the warmth, a couple of cold fronts brought a dusting of snow to the Big Bend region on the 2nd-3rd and Permian Basin on the 10th-11th. Overall, precipitation varied region-wide as most locations received around 0.25" to 0.50" with higher totals occurring over the northeast Permian Basin and lower Trans Pecos.
