

Regional Climate Summary

May 2023

Weather Forecast Office
Midland/Odessa, TX
Issued June 10, 2023 3:18 PM CT



- Overall, temperatures were within a degree or two of normal for much of the region with the exception of the Presidio Valley and Big Bend which were a few to several degrees below normal.
- A number of spots hit the jackpot for rain, like the Big Bend, the eastern half of the Permian Basin, and the Presidio Valley.
- A “trace” of snow was recorded at NWS Midland as hail fell on May 22nd and goes down in the climate record as “snow”.
- Fire weather dominated the first week of May with exceedingly dry conditions for much of the region.
- Severe weather season ramped for the rest of May with plenty of reports of hail, severe wind gusts, and a few landspouts like the one pictured below!
