
Regional Climate Summary

September 2022

September began where August left off in an active wet pattern, especially across the mountains of West TX where abundant rainfall continued through the first week of the month. Widespread 2 to 3 inches of rain accumulated across the Trans Pecos, Davis Mountains and Big Bend region, which resulted in prolonged flooding along the Rio Grande and Pecos River. Flood warnings remained in effect along these rivers for most of the month until river levels fell below flood stage during the last week of September. The flooding resulted in campsite closures in Big Bend National Park, as well as road closures along the border. The rain exited the region just as quickly as it arrived and September finished out in a drier pattern with above-normal temperatures.
