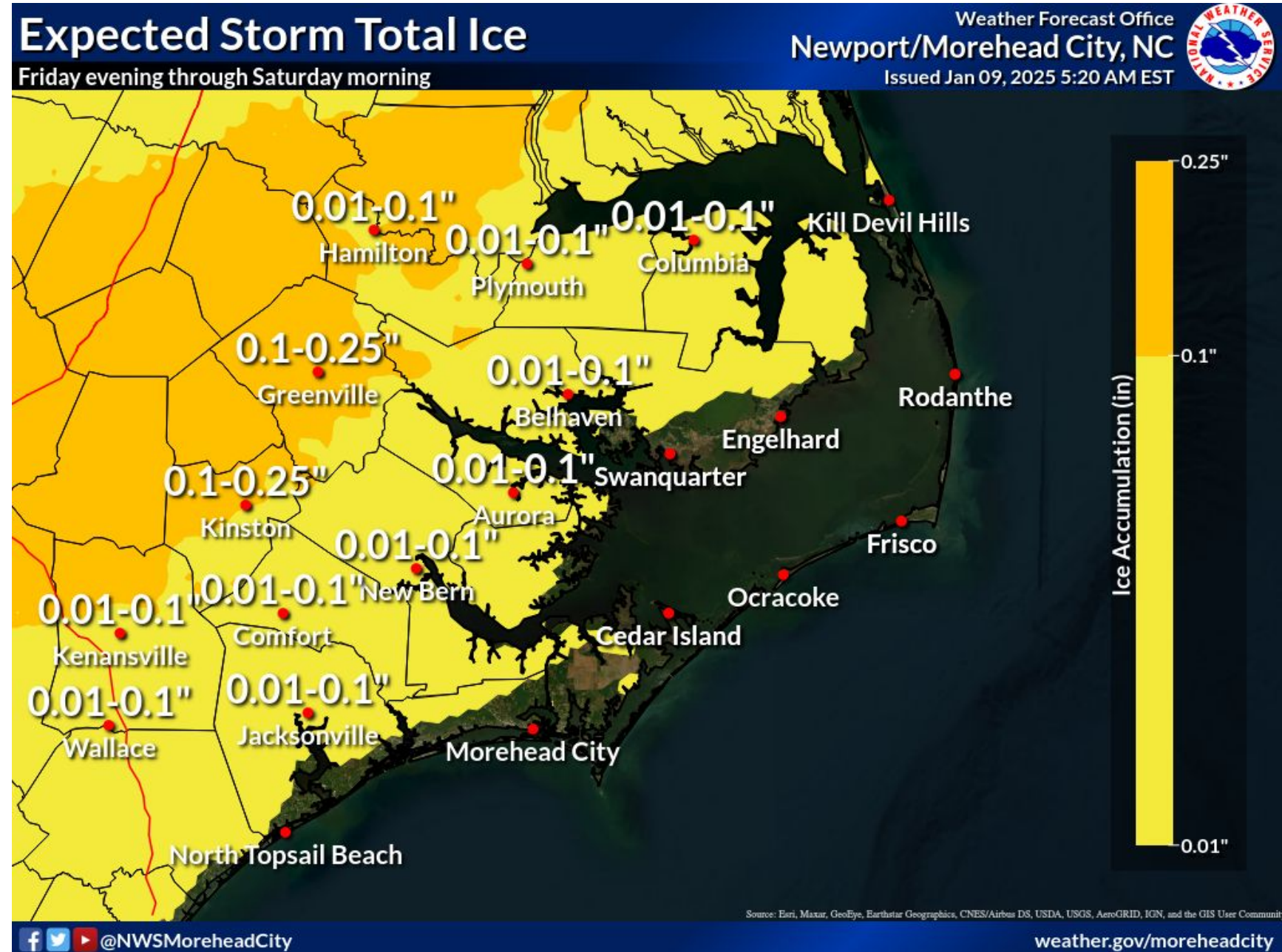

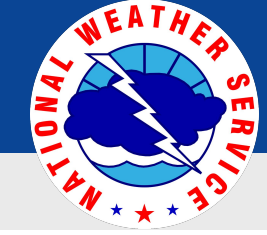

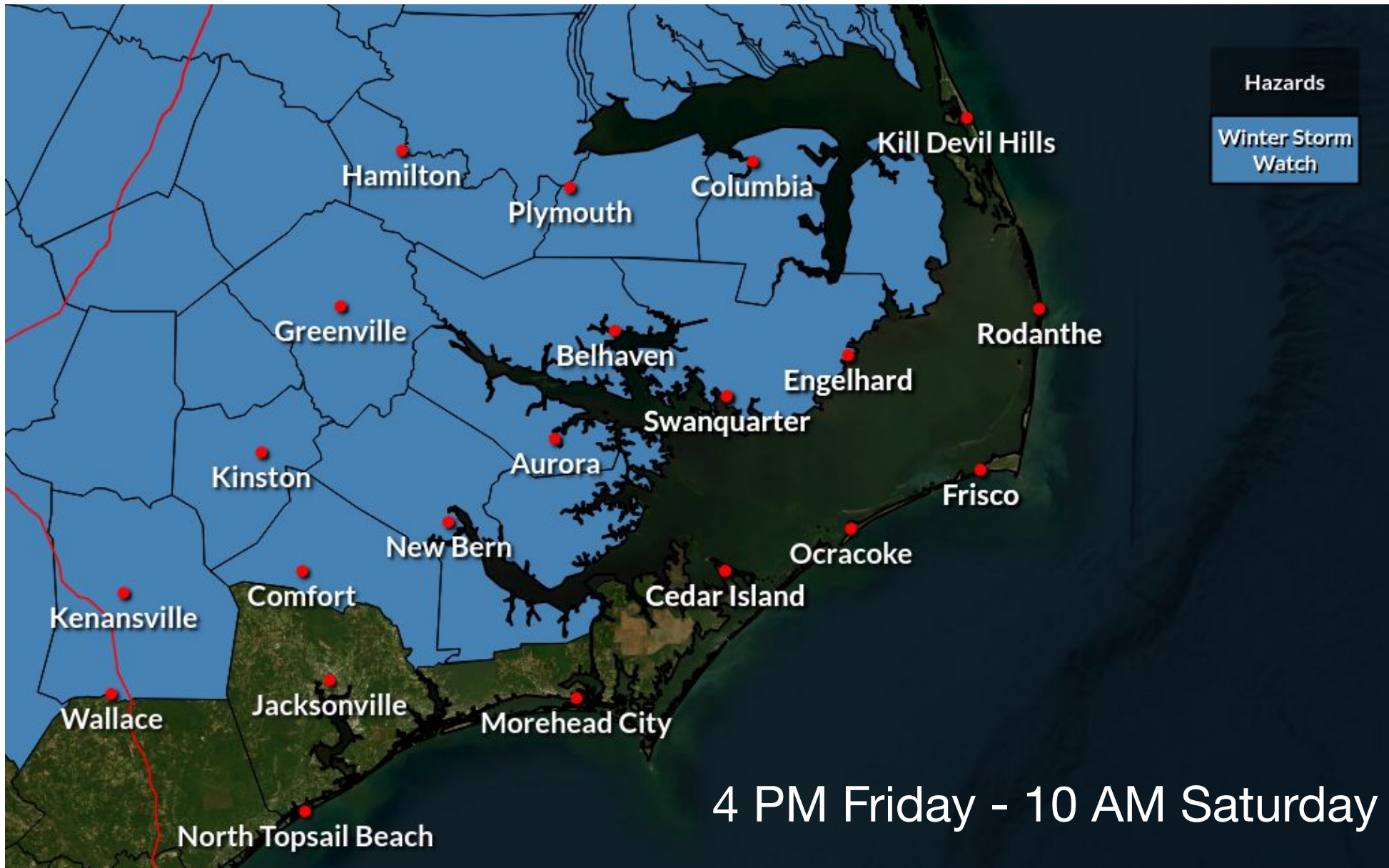
- Increased ice amounts

- Winter Storm WATCH issued for part of the area





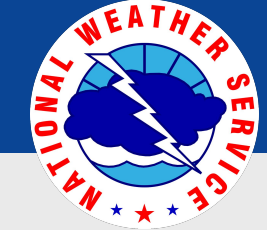
Winter Storm Watch

- Biggest impact overnight Friday.
- Heavier freezing rain and snow are MOST LIKELY the farther NORTH and WEST you live.
- Areas included in watch are subject to change with forecast adjustments

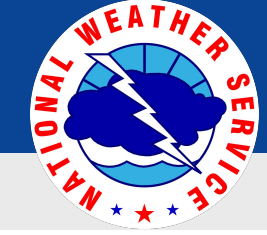

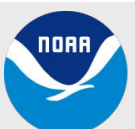
What We Know

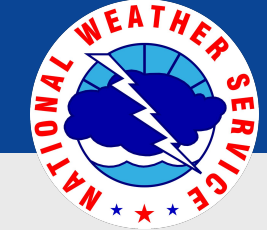
- Highest threat for snow and ice will be inland from the coast
- The majority of the event will be Friday night/early Saturday

Uncertainties

- Amounts are dependent on the storm track and MAY CHANGE dramatically from town to town, especially as you go inland.

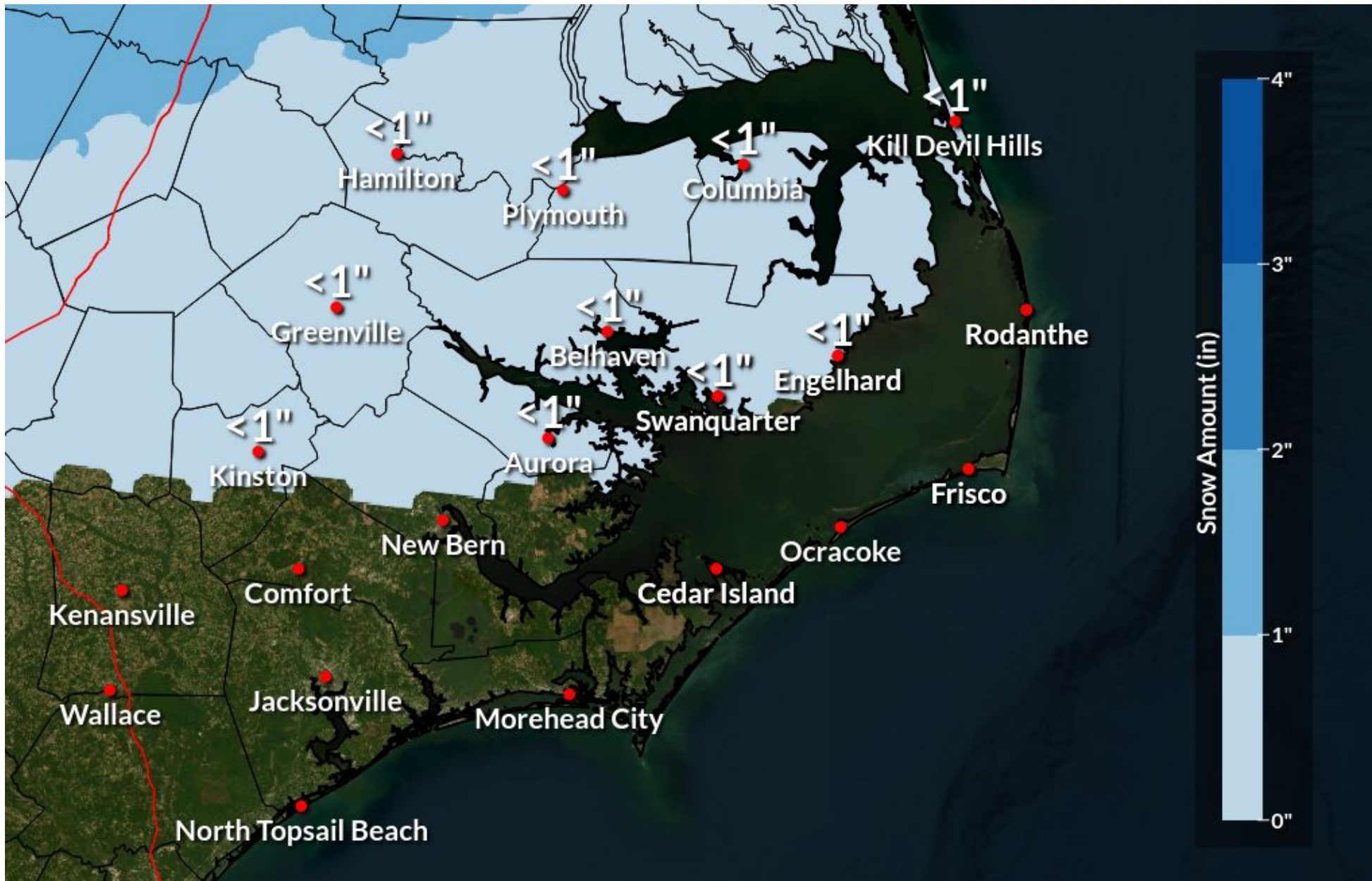

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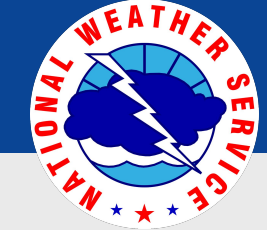
Expected Storm Total Snowfall

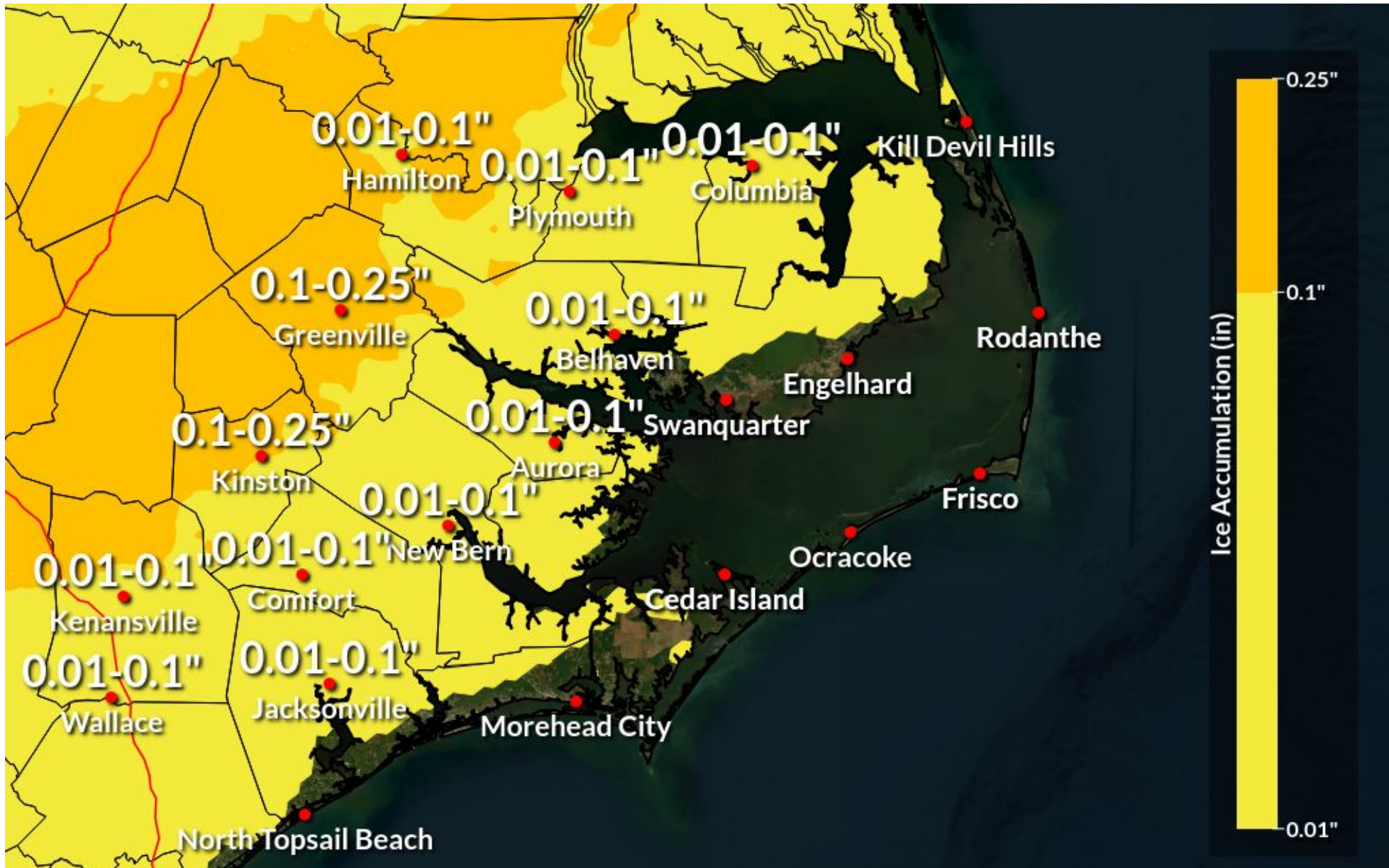
- Biggest impact overnight Friday.

- Biggest impact overnight Friday.
- Heavier icing is MOST LIKELY the farther NORTH and WEST you live.
- A small amount of ice can have a big impact, especially on bridges and overpasses.



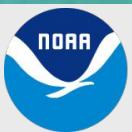
Ice and Snow, Take it Slow

Leave extra space between you and the vehicle in front of you



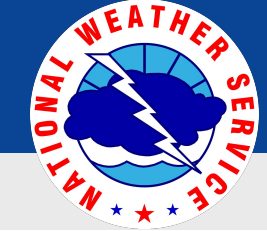
