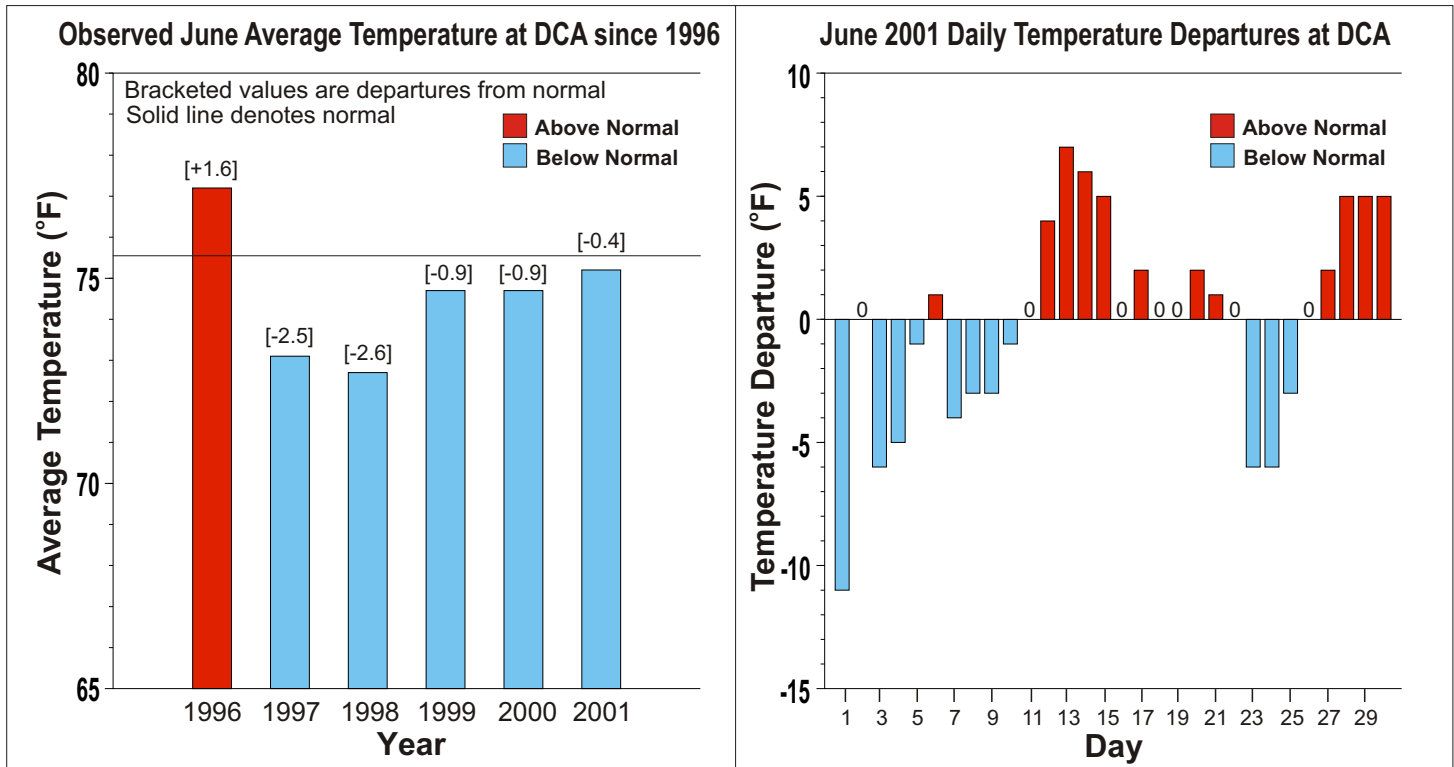




**PRECIPITATION SUMMARY AND TEMPERATURE OBSERVATIONS  
FOR THE WASHINGTON, DC & BALTIMORE, MD AREA**

**JUNE 2001**

**FIFTH CONSECUTIVE COOLER THAN NORMAL JUNE AT  
DCA, BUT THE WARMEST SINCE 1996**



**HIGHLIGHTS**

- Near-normal temperatures and slightly above-normal precipitation across most of the Washington/Baltimore area;
- Warmest June since 1996 at both DCA and IAD, since 1995 at BWI;
- 18 days with at or below normal temperatures at DCA;
- 5 days with 90°F+ highs at DCA (6 at BWI and 5 at IAD), including four consecutive such days from the 27-30th;
- Fifth consecutive cooler than normal June at DCA;
- Wettest June at IAD (4.77") since 1996;
- Severe thunderstorms battered the area on the 22nd-23rd, generating over 5" of rain, flash flooding, wind gusts over 60 mph, downed trees and power lines, numerous power outages and reports of property damage;
- Record daily precipitation (2.06") observed at IAD on the 22nd;
- Near-normal January-June precipitation at the three major airports.
