TRANSFER PATHWAY GUIDE 2023-2024

Associate in Arts to Bachelor of Arts in African
American and Africana Studies

Overview

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for an Associate in Arts at KCTCS as well as UK Core requirements for the University of Kentucky and pre-major requirements for the BA degree in African American and Africana Studies.

Admission Requirements

Students must meet the University admission requirements to be admitted into any major within the College of Arts and Sciences.

KCTCS students planning to transfer to the University of Kentucky should work closely with a UK Transfer Advisor each semester to ensure that both KCTCS and UK degree requirements are met.

Degree Requirements

The College of Arts & Sciences requires that students complete foreign language courses above the university requirement. Students must either: 1) Obtain proficiency through the fourth level of one language or 2) Obtain proficiency through the third level of a language different from that taken in high school. The high school language must have been taken through the second level. All students are provided the opportunity to take a placement exam in any language to determine the appropriate class.

General Transfer Requirements

All prospective transfer students are encouraged to receive advising from the University of Kentucky Transfer Center. Appointments are offered online and in-person, and can be scheduled online at <https://www.uky.edu/admission/transfer-advising>.
