• Shatter, Wax, Budder, Crumble

- THC "extract" or distillation
- Shatter –
 Amber/Glass-like
- Wax/Budder –
 Soft Solid



Vaping

A legal Distinction: Hemp vs. Marijuana

- "Hemp" vs "Marijuana"
 - 2018 Farm Bill redefined "Marijuana"
 - "Hemp" removed from definition of "marijuana"
 - "Hemp" = any cannabis plant, or derivative thereof, that contains not more than 0.3 percent delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol ("THC")
 - Hemp removed from CSA Schedule I
 - Hemp-derived CBD is only legal if cultivated consistent with 2018 Farm Bill



What is CBD?

- Cannabidiol (CBD):
 - Derived from Cannabis plant
 - Many forms, oil is most popular
 - Touted as "non-intoxicating/nonpsychoactive"
 - Medical Uses
 - Heavily studied for its use in wide variety of health issues
 - Most significant and reliable evidence showing effectiveness for epilepsy





What is CBD? (continued)

- "Research CBD" vs "Commercial CBD"
 - Lots of claims from marketers, but lack of consistent oversight/quality Control
 - i.e., Does the product label ACCURATELY reflect nature/content of product? Were the levels accurately and reliably tested?
 - Who verifies the veracity?
 - FDA mainly focused on unsubstantiated claims of "curing" serious disease
 - May still contain THC



What is CBD? (continued)

- "Will a USDOT drug test find CBD?"
 - Technical answer is NO
 - USDOT tests for THC, not CBD
 - However, many CBD products have varying levels of remnant THC ... so maybe a better question to ask is....



What is CBD? (continued)


- ◆ So, "If I use CBD, will I test positive for THC?"
 - Possible (likelihood varies). Some CBD products under state laws have high levels of THC, other CBD products have 0-0.3% THC
 - How much CBD product do you use? How LONG have you consistently used that product?
 - Bottom Line:
 - Use of marijuana is prohibited at ALL times under USDOT-FTA
 - If THC is found at/above cut-off levels, USDOT test will always be POSITIVE (source of THC is 100% irrelevant)



Illicit THC Potency Over Time

Today's cannabis is a lot stronger than its predecessors




Recreational vs. Medical vs. Decriminalized

- What does "Medical" Marijuana mean?
 - How many states have passed "Medical"?
 - 38, plus Puerto Rico
- What does "Decriminalized" Marijuana mean?



Recreational vs. Medical vs. Decriminalized







Percentage of Americans Living in a:

State w/ Recreational Marijuana Laws	54%
State w/ Recreational or Medical Marijuana Laws	74%
County w/ at least 1 cannabis dispensary	79%

Dispensaries often cluster near the borders of states with less permissive marijuana laws

Number of dispensaries in a 10-mile area



- 1 in 5 dispensaries
 - Located within 20 miles of a state border
- 29% of these border dispensaries adjoin a neighboring state with less permissive cannabis laws
- Oklahoma has the most dispensaries in the U.S., per capita



Oral fluid drug testing will NOT change this!



Presence vs. Impairment

- USDOT tests for presence of drugs, NOT IMPAIRMENT
 - Make this VERY clear in your policies and <u>in your</u>
 <u>employee training</u>
- Employees have responsibility to avoid inadvertent ingestion



Federal vs. State

- ◆ THC is still Federally illegal... USDOT is a Federal test
- "Prescription" / medical recommendation for Marijuana (THC)
 - Will NOT save anyone from a USDOT positive test result
 - ** Some "MROs" don't even know this!
- "Safety-Sensitive"
 - Defined by USDOT/USDOT-Agency only



Employer Policy Choices

- ◆ Zero Tolerance vs 2nd Chance
 - Driver shortages
 - Shift in understanding of addiction issues
 - Shift in public opinion of Marijuana, etc.
- THC positive tests
 - Different discipline for THC vs. other drugs?
 - Medical vs. Recreational?
 - Union negotiation point?

FAQs & Myth-busting

Passive Exposure

- "Can someone test positive for THC from secondhand smoke (aka Passive Exposure)?"
 - Yes, but unlikely, even with today's increased
 THC levels
 - USDOT tests have "cutoff" levels that are established (in part) for this reason



FAQs & Myth-busting

CBD

- "As a transit employee, can I use CBD products?"
 - o Can vs Should?
 - o OTC vs Rx/Research?
 - Safety Concerns (no oversight)?

Employer Policies and Employee Education

- Make sure your training is covering:
 - State Marijuana laws' impact on USDOT testing programs
 - THC vs CBD
 - Federal, State, Employer, Personal Health
 - Drug testing: Impairment vs. Presence
 - Passive Exposure
 - Passenger Trips/Possession on Transit Vehicles



Workplace Training

Employer Policies and Employee Education

- Enhance your Reasonable Suspicion Training
 - Don't just do it for the "check in the box"
 - Seek new training for refresher classes
 - Focus on "fitness for duty" & safety issues
 - New Marijuana Laws
