

Every year, the Public Transportation (PT) section reaches out to providers, stakeholders, state and local officials and interested parties to share topics of use to the transit industry through an annual summit. This year's PT Summit, in Coeur d'Alene September 24-26, featured an agenda packed with top-notch speakers, facts, data and inspiration.

Speakers included Scott Bogren the Director of Public Transportation Policy at The Community Transportation Association of America (CTAA), John Martin from the S.I.R. Institute for Tomorrow, and Chad Ingle from Kootenai County, showcasing how they are stepping into the future, using data and surveys. ITD's own Justin Smith taught the group about de-escalation techniques and MOREPIES, Tim Thornton spoke on the benefits of transit in Idaho and Sean Oswald discussed trends in cannabis use.

There was a micro transit panel discussion with Maxine Durand, and Kade Marquez & Steve Murray from Downtowner. The Public Transportation Advisory Council (PTAC) held a roundtable with providers in their

districts, where they got to speak to their representative face-to-face and discuss transit issues for their organization. The Federal Transit Authority (FTA) sent two representatives to help providers with tips and tricks and broach upcoming changes.

The summit closed with an awards ceremony and a PTAC meeting. The first Transit Spotlight videos were shown to the group throughout the first day. Guests were also provided with ample time for networking.
