Student Center for Social Justice Identi-

ty: [Vanderbilt] fosters an environment of inclusion and multiculturalism by increasing students' development around intercultural competence and social justice as well as promoting co-curricular programming that celebrates and recognizes the various cultures of the Vanderbilt student body.

Peabody Latinx Alumni and Student Association (PLASA): aims to connect alumni and students of Latinx backgrounds at Peabody College to foster a supportive community rich with culture.
