Scallop Committee Report

Framework 39

Action 1: Overfishing Limit and Acceptable Biological Catch

1. Ms. Griffin moved on behalf of the Committee: that the Council adopt in Section 4.1, Alternative 4.1.2, Updated OFL (Over Fishing Limit) and ABC (Acceptable Biological Catch) for FY 2025 and FY 2026, as the preferred alternative.

The motion *carried* by unanimous consent.

Action 2.1 – Northern Gulf of Maine Management and Total Allowable Landing (TAL) Setting

- 2. Ms. Griffin moved on behalf of the Committee:
 - that the Council adopt in Section 4.2.1, Alternative 2, Option 1, Set NGOM (Northern Gulf of Maine) TAL, with set-asides to support research, monitoring, and a directed LAGC fishery. Set NGOM TAL at F=0.18 using Stellwagen, Ipswich, Jeffreys Ledge, and Machias Seal Island, as the preferred alternative.
 - 2025 NGOM TAL would be set at 712,093 lb.
 - 2025 NGOM set-aside would be set at 675,563 lb.
 - 2026 NGOM set-aside would be set at 506,672 lb.

The motion *carried* by unanimous consent.

Action 2.2 – Northern Gulf of Maine Possession Restriction

3. Ms. Griffin moved on behalf of the Committee:

that the Council adopt in Section 4.2.2, Alternative 2 (4.2.2.2), Allow NGOM-permitted vessels on a declared NGOM trip to possess scallops and transit outside of the NGOM scallop management area, as the preferred alternative.

Action 3 – Fishery Specifications

4. Ms. Griffin moved on behalf of the Committee:

That the Council adopt in Section 4.3, Alternative 6, 24 days-at-sea, two access area trips with 12,000-pound trip limit, as the preferred alternative. This would allocate the following access area trips and days at sea to full-time Limited Access permit holders:

- One trip to Area I and one trip to Area II, 12,000 lb trip limit
- 24 days-at-sea (Average Open Bottom F=0.27).

Action 4 – LAGC IFQ Access Area fishing in 2025

5. Ms. Griffin moved on behalf of the Committee: that the Council adopt in Section 4.4, Alternative 2 (4.4.2) Update LAGC IFQ Access Area Trip Allocations, Distribute LAGC IFQ Access Area Allocation to Area I and Area

II as the preferred alternative. The total access area trip allocations for the LAGC IFQ for FY 2025 would be 571 trips.

Action 5 – Scallop RSA Compensation Fishing

6. Ms. Griffin moved on behalf of the Committee: that the Council adopt in Section 4.5, Alternative 2 (4.5.2), Allow up to 50% of RSA Compensation fishing in Area I and Area II Access Areas, as the preferred alternative.

RSA compensation fishing would be permitted only in Area I and Area II Access Areas, areas open to LA DAS fishing, and up to 25,000 pounds of RSA harvest from the NGOM. Up to 50% of the total RSA compensation pounds available outside of the NGOM (625,000 pounds) would be available between both Area I and Area II Access Areas. Unlike the access areas, there would not be a limit on the amount of RSA compensation pounds that can be harvested from the open bottom.

6a. Ms. Griffin moved to amend and Mr. Pappalardo seconded: that the Council modify the language of Section 4.5, Alternative 2 (4.5.2), Allow up to 50% of RSA Compensation fishing in Area I and Area II Access Areas, and adopt as the preferred alternative.

RSA compensation fishing for pounds allocated in FY 2025 would be permitted only in Area I and Area II Access Areas, areas open to LA DAS fishing, and up to 25,000 pounds of RSA harvest from the NGOM. Up to 50% of the FY 2025 RSA compensation pounds available outside of the NGOM (625,000 pounds) would be available between both Area I and Area II Access Areas. Unlike the access areas, there would not be a limit on the amount of RSA compensation pounds that can be harvested from the open bottom.

RSA compensation pounds are restricted to being harvest from the areas specified in the fishing year they were allocated. For example, 2024 RSA allocations being fished in FY 2025 would only be available in Area II, areas open to LA DAS fishing, and up to 25,000 pounds from the NGOM. Vessels would not be allowed to fish any 2024 RSA compensation pounds in Area I.

Rationale: Avoids unintended impacts of previous year's RSA pounds being fished from access areas other than what the Council had specified based on the best available science informing the appropriate level of harvest from an access area in a given fishing year.

The motion to amend *carried* by unanimous consent

that the Council modify the language of Section 4.5, Alternative 2 (4.5.2), Allow up to 50% of RSA Compensation fishing in Area I and Area II Access Areas, and adopt as the preferred alternative.

RSA compensation fishing for pounds allocated in FY 2025 would be permitted only in Area I and Area II Access Areas, areas open to LA DAS fishing, and up to 25,000 pounds of RSA harvest from the NGOM. Up to 50% of the FY 2025 RSA compensation pounds available outside of the NGOM (625,000 pounds) would be available between both Area I and Area II Access Areas. Unlike the access areas, there would not be a limit on the amount of RSA compensation pounds that can be harvested from the open bottom.

RSA compensation pounds are restricted to being harvest from the areas specified in the fishing year they were allocated. Vessels would not be allowed to fish any 2024 RSA compensation pounds in Area I.

Vessels would have 60-days after May 15 to harvest access area allocations from the previous fishing year.

Action 7 – Area II Seasonal Closure

8. Ms. Griffin moved on behalf of the Committee: to recommend that the Council adopt in Section 4.7, Alternative 2, Option 3 (4.7.3), Seasonal closure of Area II from November 15 to May 15, as the preferred alternative. Vessels would have 60-days after May 15 to harvest access area allocations from the previous fishing year.

Development and review of the GeoSAMS model should be done as time allows.
