
## Words and phrases to know in 2025

- Algorithmic bias: Occurs when an algorithm makes systemic and repeated errors that disadvantage certain groups of people. The technology used to review the job applicant resumes exhibited algorithmic bias because it unfairly eliminated people in the early stages of the hiring process.
- Attention economy: A concept describing how human attention has become a valuable resource in the digital era, where there is constant content and information overload. In an attention economy, social media influencers help brands capture people's interest.
- Cultural whitewater: The challenge of living during a time of social, political, and economic upheaval. Families struggle with the cultural whitewater impacting our nation.
- Delulu: Slang term for "delusional," describing someone who has unreasonable or unrealistic expectations. In hindsight, fans were delulu thinking that their team would be undefeated.
- **Friendshoring:** Prioritizing production and trade with geopolitical allies or countries that share similar political values. By encouraging the import of oil from Canada instead of Iran, the United States practices friendshoring.
- **Glow-up:** A positive transformation or evolution in a person's appearance, confidence, or lifestyle over a period of time. A glow-up often involves personal growth, enhanced self-care, and a significant increase in self-esteem.

- Illuminators: A human typology describing someone who is genuinely curious about others; they shine the brightness of their care on people and make them feel bigger, deeper, and respected. David Brooks reminds us that the world needs more illuminators.
- Relentless incrementalism: A growth mindset that emphasizes persistent, small, committed, and intentional steps towards achieving a long-term goal. Much like hiking to a summit, improving health outcomes requires the relentless incrementalism of ongoing, dedicated, small purposeful steps.
- Underconsumption core: A social media trend that emphasizes minimalism and simplicity by encouraging individuals to purchase only what they truly need and to fully utilize their possessions before replacing them. I am embracing underconsumption core by not buying the latest viral water bottle; the one I already have is good enough.
- **Vibe check:** A slang term that means to make sure someone is having a good time or to assess their mood. You might ask a friend, "Vibe check?" instead of "How are you?".
- Virtual influencer: An Al or computer-generated social media personality. Major brands are willing to use virtual influencers to promote their products because they can be quickly and inexpensively modeled to meet their needs across different platforms.

#### **Utah Household Composition, 1970-2023**



#### **Fifty Years of Financial Milestones**



### **Utah Hockey Club Arena Capacity and Season Ticket Deposits, 2024**



#### **Average Monthly UTA Transit Boardings, 2017-2024**




#### **Cumulative Percent Change in U.S. Grocery Prices**


Share of U.S. Households Without Meaningful Homeowners Insurance, 2023

#### Headline, Core, and Motor Vehicle Insurance Inflation, Year-Over CPI, 1995-2024



Data since January 2001



#### Headline Innovation Intelligence Index by State, 2023



#### 10-Year Treasury Constant Maturity Minus 2-Year and 3-Month Treasury Constant Maturity, 1988-2024



#### Transition into Serious Delinquency (90+) by Loan Type, U.S., 2003-2024 Q3



#### Utah's Top Exports and Imports, Goods and Countries, 2023




#### Share of Population Enrolled in Medicaid by State, August 2024


#### **S&P 500 Average Monthly Return Since 1928**

#### Percent Change in Overall Employment by Place of Birth and State, January 2020-July 2024



#### **Economic Connectedness Index by State, 2022**



#### The Federal Budget, FY 2024




#### Federal Direct Statutory Funding and Regular Appropriation Spending as Share of GDP, FY 1974-2024

#### Federal Grants per Capita by State, FY 2024




#### State and Local Total Business Tax Collections as Percentage of Private Sector State GDP, FY 2022


#### Utah State and Local Effective Sales Tax Rates, FY 1933-2024


#### Number of Utah Local Governments Imposing the Zoo, Arts, and Parks (ZAP) Tax, FY 1997-2023




#### Price of Utah Starter Home, 2010-2024

#### Share of Existing Utah Mortgages by Interest Rate, 2013-2024Q2



#### Utah Projected Household Growth, 2024-2033




#### Short-Term Rentals as a Share of Total Housing Units by County, 2023

#### Utah Rural and Urban Housing Units by Vacancy Type, 2023






### **Median Home Sale Price by County, 2024Q2**





#### Grand County Real Visitor Spending & Arches National Park Visitation, 2022-2024 vs 2019






#### Utah Skier/Snowboarder Origin, 2023/2024 Season


# Who's spending in Utah?






#### **Utah Net Power Generation by Source, 2000-2023**


#### Utah Electric and Hybrid Vehicle Sales, 2015-2024


#### Public Electric Vehicle Charging Stations in Utah, 2024


#### Great Salt Lake Water Year-End Level, 1903-2024

#### Residential Potable Water Consumption, Gallons per Capita per Day, 2017-2022




#### Market Value of Agriculture Products Sold per Acre-Foot of Water Depleted, 2017-2022


### Land Ownership by Type in Utah, 2024

#### Utah's Projected Geriatric Physician Supply and Demand, 2021-2036



### Primary Care Physician Rate per 100,000 Population by State, 2021





### Kindergarten vaccination exemptions


#### Vaccination Exemptions Among Kindergartners, Utah and U.S., 2012-13 to 2023-24 School Years

#### Utah Suicide Rate per 100,000 Population by Age Group and Sex, 2021-2023 (combined)




#### Share of Utahns Reporting Social Isolation by Grade (Youth) and Age Group (Adults), 2022 and 2023


#### Share of Utah 6th Graders by Select Measures of Device Use and Social Isolation, 2019-2023

#### Comparison of Decreased Mortality Across Social Connection and Leading Health Indicators












#### Utah Participation in Full-day Kindergarten, 2021-22 to 2023-24 School Years


#### **Utah Public Teacher Salaries, FY2020-2024**


#### Annual Absolute and Percent Change in Utah's College-age Population, 2010-2060


#### Share of K-12 Students Enrolled in Public School by State, 2023-24 School Year


#### Pupil/Teacher Ratio by State, 2022-23 School Year


#### **Projected Population Change by County, 2024-2033**


### Share of Out-of-State Migrants Returning to their Place of Birth, 2023


#### California Migrants to Utah & Utah Migrants to California, 1980, 1990, 2000, 2005-2022

## **Total Fertility Rate by State, 2022**



## Utah's Asian Population by Regional Group and Detailed Origin, 2020



## Utah's Detailed Pacific Islander Alone Group Populations, 1990-2020



## Utah's 10 Fastest Growing Hispanic or Latino Detailed Origin Groups, 2010 to 2020




## Utah's Largest Middle Eastern and North African Detailed Race Groups, 2020


## Utah's Retirement Age Population, 1970-2060


## Utah Housing Tenure by Age of Householder, 2023

## Percent of County Population Living in a Rural Area, 2020






