

## Emergency and Disaster Response Fund Awards November 14 – November 20, 2024 26 Awards Totaling \$3,341,100

**\$23,700** to **Mission Ministries Alliance** for debris removal and site stabilization at its shelter in McDowell County.

**\$25,000** to **Appalachian Mountain Community Health Centers** to fully restore the operations of six clinics and a mobile van serving Buncombe, Jackson, Graham, and Cherokee counties.

**\$50,000 to The Arc of North Carolina** to replace essential office equipment so that services for individuals with disabilities can resume in the WNC Region.

**\$50,000** to **Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity** to support rebuilding its administrative offices and ReStore in Buncombe County.

**\$25,000** to **Beacon of Hope Services** to provide essential supplies to people impacted by the hurricane in Madison, Mitchell, Avery, Yancey, and northern Buncombe counties.

**\$142,600** to **Blue Ridge Partnership for Children** to assist with costs that will help seven childcare facilities in Avery, Mitchell, and Yancey counties reopen.

**\$25,000** to **Bounty & Soul** to provide home goods assistance and food support to individuals affected by the hurricane in Buncombe County.

**\$12,500** to **Brush Creek Elementary School** to provide essential supplies to students' families who were impacted by the hurricane in Madison County.

**\$280,000** to **Buncombe Partnership for Children** to support re-opening costs at eight childcare facilities that are currently inoperable due to facility damage caused by the storm.

**\$25,000** to **California Creek Baptist Church** to provide essential services and supplies to people impacted by the hurricane in Yancey, Mitchell, Buncombe, and Madison counties.

**\$250,000** to **Centro Unido Latino-Americano** to provide continued direct assistance to individuals and families affected by the hurricane and to support them in stabilizing their housing in McDowell, Buncombe, Burke, and Mitchell counties.

**\$25,000** to **Circle of Mercy** to provide care to patients from Buncombe, Haywood, Jackson, Madison, McDowell, Mitchell, Rutherford, Transylvania, and Yancey counties as well as the Qualla Boundary who are being released from the hospital but who cannot return home due to damages caused by the hurricane.

**\$25,000** to **Culture's Edge** to provide essential supplies and services to communities affected by the hurricane in Rutherford and Buncombe counties.

**\$25,000** to **Dayspring Foundation** to provide financial assistance for basic needs to people in substance abuse recovery who were affected by the hurricane in Buncombe, Rutherford, and McDowell counties.

**\$25,000** to **Highlands Community Child Development Center** to replace the facility's roof that was damaged by the hurricane in Macon County.

**\$25,000** to **Literacy Together** to provide essential services to clients who were affected by the hurricane in Buncombe County and to help them navigate FEMA, employment, and other issues.

**\$25,000** to **Love and Respect Community for Recovery and Wellness** to provide essential supplies and services to people impacted by the hurricane in Henderson, Transylvania, Buncombe, Polk, and Rutherford counties.

**\$12,500** to **Madison High School** to provide essential supplies to students' families affected by the hurricane in Madison County.

**\$50,000** to **Mountain Community Health Partnership** for costs associated with the temporary relocation of its Micaville facility in Yancey County.

**\$25,000** to **North Carolina Hmong Women Association** to provide essentials supplies and services to Hmong people impacted by the hurricane in Burke and McDowell counties.

**\$25,000** to **Partners Unlimited** to provide essential supplies to low-income families affected by the hurricane in Buncombe County.

**\$35,000** to **RiverLink** to engage volunteers to remediate Helene-damaged streams on private property in the French Broad Watershed.

**\$25,000** to **Rutherford Housing Partnership** to provide critical home repairs for low-income people whose homes were damaged by the hurricane in Rutherford County.

**\$50,000** to **Southern Appalachian Highlands Conservancy** for critical infrastructure repairs, including roads and bridges on conserved properties, in the WNC Region.

**\$2,000,000** to **North Carolina Synod, ELCA** to partner with Mennonite Disaster Services in rebuilding private bridges destroyed by the hurricane, focusing on Avery, Mitchell, Yancey, Madison, Rutherford, and Buncombe counties.

**\$59,800** to **Western North Carolina Regional Educational Foundation** to create a temporary position assisting WNC School systems in assessing and prioritizing needs that arise during recovery and researching and coordinating groups to help meet those needs.
