



**Emergency and Disaster Response Fund Awards
October 31 – November 6, 2024
30 Awards Totaling \$1,188,100**

\$50,000 to **Arrowhead Artists and Artisans League** toward rebuilding studio space lost to the hurricane in McDowell County.

\$50,000 to **Asheville GreenWorks** to help people clean their properties in Buncombe County.

\$50,000 to **Asheville-Buncombe Community Land Trust** to repair homes damaged from the storm in Buncombe County.

\$50,000 to **Black Mountain Home for Children, Youth & Families** toward cleaning and restoring its campus serving the WNC Region.

\$44,600 to **Black Wall Street AVL** to replace essential equipment, furniture, and supplies lost in the flood at its facility in Buncombe County.

\$25,000 to **Burke County United Way** to provide essential services and supplies to people affected by the hurricane in Burke County.

\$12,500 to **Delta House Life Development of Asheville** for tree removal and fence repair at the facility, and to provide essential winter supplies and transportation to youth from low-income families in Buncombe County.

\$25,000 to **Faith in Harm Reduction** to purchase naloxone, test strips, and wound care supplies for Buncombe, Yancey, and Mitchell counties.

\$25,000 to **High Country Caregiver Foundation** to provide essential services and supplies to kinship families affected by the hurricane in Avery, Mitchell, and Yancey counties.

\$25,000 to **IFB Solutions, Asheville division** to offset inventory, transportation and other costs resulting from warehouse damage sustained during the storm in Buncombe County.

\$25,000 to **Loving Hearts for Christ B.E.A.R. Closet** to provide essential supplies to children and their families in McDowell County and for storage capacity while facility repairs are made.

\$25,000 to **Madison County Rotary Club Foundation** to meet the emerging needs of youth who have been affected by the hurricane in Madison County.

\$25,000 to **Madison Early College High School** to provide essential services and supplies to students and their families who were impacted by the hurricane in Madison County.

\$50,000 to **Medical Loan Closet of Henderson County** to replace lost equipment and rebuild its facility that serves Henderson, Polk, Transylvania, Buncombe, and Rutherford counties.

\$25,000 to **Montreat College** for building and property repair in Buncombe County.

\$50,000 to **Mountain Valleys RC&D Council** for debris removal and streambank stabilization in Madison, Buncombe, McDowell, Transylvania, Henderson, Polk, and Rutherford counties.

\$25,000 to **MountainCare** for water damage remediation and safety adaptations such as alternative water sourcing and enhanced sanitation protocols needed at facilities in Henderson and Buncombe counties.

\$50,000 to **MountainTrue** toward surface and well-water testing, source-point pollution tracking, and clean-up and debris removal at public river access points in Henderson, Buncombe, Madison, Polk, Mitchell, Yancey, Haywood, and Avery counties.

\$25,000 to **Oshun Mountain Sanctuary** for facility repairs, tree and debris removal, equipment, and well restoration in Buncombe County.

\$50,000 to **Preservation Society of Asheville and Buncombe** to repair historic buildings damaged by the hurricane in Buncombe County.

\$50,000 to **Rutherford County Habitat for Humanity** to provide repairs to homes damaged by Hurricane Helene in Rutherford, Polk, and McDowell counties.

\$11,000 to **Shiloh Community Association** for food distribution, resident street connectors, and tree removal in the Buncombe County community.

\$25,000 to **Sunrise Community for Recovery & Wellness** to address gaps in access to basic needs, including hygiene essentials, mental health care, and substance use recovery support for people affected by the storm in the WNC Region.

\$50,000 to **The Community Kitchen** toward relocation after its building was destroyed by the flood in Haywood County.

\$25,000 to **The Salvation Army Hendersonville** to provide financial assistance to people affected by the hurricane in Henderson, Polk and Transylvania counties.

\$25,000 to **The Tipton Hill Community Foundation** to provide repairs or help to rebuild homes damaged by the hurricane in Mitchell and Yancey counties.

\$15,000 to **University of North Carolina at Asheville Foundation** for wellness calls to elders participating in the North Carolina Center for Health and Wellness program and affected by the hurricane in the WNC Region.

\$25,000 to **Women of Waynesville** to address critical needs of women and children affected by Hurricane Helene in Haywood County.

\$230,000 to **Working Wheels** to repair or provide maintenance to nonprofit agencies using organization vehicles for recovery and response efforts and to provide cars to low-income people who lost their transportation resource due to the hurricane in the WNC Region.

\$25,000 to **Yancey County Health Department** to purchase telehealth equipment needed to reach community members whose roads have been damaged or are otherwise inaccessible due to the hurricane in Yancey County.
